### A. Consider and Discuss Resolution No. 2023-06-26

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, REGARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING "WATER METERS".

Mr. Archer presented the Council with proposed financing for the new water meter project through Government Capital Corporation for \$476,919.90 with a 5.2% interest rate.

Johnson, and Whetstone all stated that they were not in favor of leasing the described property because of the cost to survey and parcel the property and that the property would be useless when the lake level rises.
