

Going on Sabbatical -----

----- With Pastor Eric

“A sabbatical offers opportunity to get off the treadmill and provides an opportunity for renewal of vision and hope. It is more than just a chance to recharge your batteries for another year. It can be a life and soul-changing time, a time when perspective and the Holy Spirit can come together.” (Alban Institute)

The ELCA provides incentive for pastors to take a “sabbatical” every 6-8 years while in active ordained ministry. I have never taken a sabbatical time before in my almost 25 years of active pastoral ministry. I have always found the time to recharge during periodic drop-off’s in the flow of church activity. However, this year is different. I think that we can all gather around that notion with a shrug and a sigh. It seems that the church-building and I have something in common right now. We are tired and deflated with leaks here and there ☺ With the impact of the pandemic on our social and spiritual lives and the sudden structural derecho storm remodel on the church I am finding it both a bit trying and I am getting used to the idea that now might be a good time to get off the treadmill for a bit. You might say that God has provided both the congregation and the pastor an opportunity to step back and renew our vision and hope.

Given the current situation in the community I do not think that a full sabbatical is appropriate or helpful to either myself or the community. I propose to take a partial time of about 4-5 weeks to pursue some ministry renewal and professional training to help get us going in 2021 and beyond. I like to equate a “sabbatical” with the metaphor of a tree chopping competition. One man spent an hour continually chopping

wood, while a second man would stop every 15 minutes and sharpen his ax before going back to chopping. The man who sharpened his ax cut twice as much wood and was ready for the next part of the competition. A sabbatical is about the pastor sharpening his tools and skills for ministry so that he/she can come back stronger, smarter and with a clearer vision for what's next and the renewed energy to pursue it.

Even Jesus took a sabbatical when he went up to pray in the hills after feeding the multitudes, and then when we went to the region of Tyre and Sidon and was confronted by the Syrophenician woman with a possessed daughter, or when he went up onto the mountain during the transfiguration event with his three closest disciples. Remember that Peter wanted to stay up there, but Jesus said that they had to go back down the mountain and ultimately to Jerusalem for one last time.

As I take time for renewal and reflection the congregation will do the same for itself. The council leaders will assist the congregation in reflecting and renewing itself along with the church building in preparation for a new year and renewed sense of mission. How exciting! You might wonder if this is the right time for such reflection. I am not sure if there is an ideal time only God's time which is not always convenient or lines up well with our ways of thinking and planning. I am willing to give it a shot for the sake of this church that I love so much and the God who called me to serve here.

I have attached the emphasis in my sabbatical plan for this Fall. It orients around the need for media and technology and sharing the message of grace in the midst of this tumultuous time.

Please keep us all in prayer throughout this journey.

Sabbatical Emphasis and Goals for Fall, 2020

1. Improve Preaching Skills

Goals

- + Prepare and Develop skills for better communication for proclamation and presentation*
- + Cultivate messaging for media platforms (podcasts, online devotions, etc.)*
- + Learn skills and practices to train laity to share faith stories and incorporate preaching-type skill*
- + Encourage others to preach and share in proclamation ministry on multiple platforms*

2. Improve Technology Integration into Ministry

Goals

- + Develop more comfort and confidence in using media platforms*
- + Learn to adapt ministry to new normal (post-pandemic) using adaptive leadership skills*
- + Work in providing podcast ministry and maximize creative arts (drama, music, etc.)*

3. Experience church in a different way in area churches as availability and safety allows – see what other worship communities have to offer during this pandemic season and reconnect with the church-at-large from the pew side of things.

Upon my resuming daily ministry at Palestine, I will provide an overview of what I have learned and provide some concrete ways that I might assist the congregation's goals for the future. These items will be mediated through the Mutual Ministry team and the Congregation Council for the sake of the community.
