PRESIDENT'S CORNER

With nice weather here I thought that I would devote this space to some "HELPFUL" tips on getting our vehicles ready for the road and all the fun activities ahead of us.

An overheating tip that may help you keep the temperature down in your car this summer is: Try spraying the fan side of the radiator with a water-soluble cleaner (Simple Green or Gunk Engine Degreaser), let it soak in, and then flush with a fine spray from a garden hose. Be sure not to use too much water pressure as you could close some of the radiator fins. A radiator with clean fins will cool more efficiently.

Some tips for the placement of decals on your T-Bird (Getting ready for the Mini Concourse)

Jacking Instructions Decal:

55 On the divider board-centered

55-57 Center of the trunk lid

Heater Decal:

On heater box top surface in engine compt.

Reads when viewer is facing the rear of the car.

Folding Top Decal:

Glove box door

Tire Pressure Decal:

Glove box door

Automatic Transmission Decal:

Glove box door

Buying an early T-Bird

Want one? Then be prepared for several things. First, the price. Expect a 1955 – '57 Thunderbird to top out around \$ 64000, although there are always exceptions. In a No. 3 condition a \$ 25000 tag is not uncommon. A Thunderbird that begs for tons of work may be priced at the \$12000 range and could be a prize winner after hours of effort and many expenses.

Next be ready for stiff competition Commonly an over-restored car. Early Thunderbirds have become the focus of a cult following, automotively speaking. Like the Corvette, owners fuss about perfection in minute details and pride themselves on ownership. It can be intense and come across as elitism in the eyes of non-Thunderbird collectors. If truth be known, developers and promoters of those early Thunderbirds probably wanted it that way. It enhanced the image.

Third, decide what you want and stick to it. Some collectors hope and dream for a 1956 Thunderbird, but settle for a 1958 because it's about half the price. What they get is a four –passenger two-seater, larger and less sporty in many respects. If you want the initial classic design, save your dough and cash it in when the right car surfaces. If you jump for the '58, be comfortable with your choice. They are fine cars in their own right.

Fourth, be ready for cautious fun. Early
Thunderbirds are adopted more than owned. They are
the objects of affection, and cannot be left alone at a car
show or on the street. They must hold the owner's
attention to avoid finger prints, dust, and scratches. If
you pop for an early Thunderbird, give it it's own
comfortable nest in a safe and dry garage, blanket it for
full protection, and use it sparingly.







How to get to Alecis meeting



Directions to May meeting at Paddington Square Club House From the North or West

Take 287 to Rt 17 South

Continue to Spring St. exit which is just after new NJ Transit rail station Make 2 lefts and continue over Rt 17

Continue past light at Franklin Turnpike (road changes to Hilltop Road).

Continue to end and make left onto Airmount Ave.

At the light (Masonicus Rd.) turn left into Paddiington Square and continue around almost to the end. Make a left on Chads Barn Ct..

Direction from South

Take Rt 17 North

Continue past Lake St/E. Crescent Ave. exit and shopping center SLOW DOWN get in right lane. Then just after Macaroni Grill Make a sharp right at (before) Dunk'in Donuts onto Airmount Ave. Continue to light

At the light (Masonicus Rd.) turn left into Paddiington Square and continue around almost to the end. Make a left on Chads Barn Ct..
