The Basics of Heraldry:

Lesson 1: Colors

The design of a Heraldic device (or a badge) follows some basic rules called Heraldic Style.

In the coming months, I will discuss these basics. It may be handy to navigate to the Baronial website and download a copy of the Order of Precedence which depicts many devices you can practice what you learn. This month, we will discuss colors.

Not all colors can be used. In our period, only certain colors were used and the SCA follows this practice. Heraldic colors, referred to as "tinctures" come in three groups: Metals, Colors, and Furs. These groups are organized in a way that allows visual contrast when used. This is called the Rule of Tincture and basically says that you cannot place a metal on top of a metal or a color on a color. You can place then next to each other in the same layer horizontally, but not vertically. When named, the term used is French in origin.

There are two metals:

- "Or" representing gold. Or is always capitalized when written. Yellow is used for Or when depicted.
- "argent" representing silver. White is used for argent as opposed to grey.

#### There are five colors:

- "vert" which is green
- "azure" which is blue
- "sable" which is black"
- "qules" which is red
- "purpure" which is purple.


<u>METALS</u>	<u>COLORS</u>

The third group, called furs, is a bit of a wildcard. Furs are a pattern instead of a solid tincture and represent the pelts of certain animals (ermine and squirrel). Some furs are considered metals, some are colors, and some are neither and termed as neutral. Which category they fall into for the purposes of the


Rule of Tincture depends on the tincture that dominates the pattern. Use of furs can be an easy way to make your design distinctive but can also be difficult to reproduce.

There are eight furs:

- "ermine" which is white with black spots and is treated as a metal
- "erminois: which is yellow with black spots and is treated as a metal
- "counter-ermine" which is black with white spots and is treated as a color
- "pean" which is black with yellow spots and is treated as a color



"vair" and "potent" and their "counter" patterns which are evenly blue and white and represent the pelt of a squirrel. Vair, Countervair, Potent, and Counterpotent are all treated as neutral which means they are not affected by the Rule of Tincture because they are considered to be evenly divided.



It is also possible to change the color of the spots provided the Rule of Tincture is followed or to change the tinctures for vair, for instance "argent ermined gules" which is white with red spots or "vairy argent and gules" which is a white and red bell pattern. If changed, the tinctures are specified when written or described. If not changed, the standard term is used which indicates the default tinctures automatically without further description. There is also a wide variety of different styles of spots that can be used in the ermine patterns but they are all treated the same regardless of how drawn.

There is one exception to the Rules mentioned called "proper". This is often used with an object, plant, or animal when colored as it would be found in nature. For instance, a tree proper is depicted with a brown trunk and green leaves even though brown is not a heraldic tincture. Not all objects, flora or fauna can be depicted as proper and this should be used with caution. A list of defined objects plants, and animals having a "proper" coloration can be found in the Glossary of Terms. The Glossary can be downloaded from the SCA College of Heralds website heraldry.sca.org. When used, it is typically handled under the Rule of Tincture as follows:

- Use of light grey or light skin tones is treated as a metal
- Use of dark grey, dark skin tones, brown (usually wood), or dark pink is treated as a color

For practice, review the Order of Precedence file and see if the devices shown satisfy the Rule of Tincture and name the tinctures used.
