Saint of the Week: St. Margaret of Cortona

Margaret was born of farming parents in Laviano, Tuscany. Her mother died when Margaret was seven. After her father remarried, life with her stepmother was so difficult that Margaret moved out. For the next nine years she lived with a local young man named Arsenio, and though they were not married she bore him a son.



Feast Day: May 16

One day she was waiting for Arsenio to come home but was instead met by his dog. The animal led Margaret into the forest where she found Arsenio murdered. The crime shocked Margaret into a life of penance. She and her son returned to Laviano, where she was not well received by her father and stepmother. They then went to the Friars Minor at Cortona where she received asylum. Eventually she joined the Third Order of St. Francis; her son joined the Franciscans a few years later.

Margaret later founded a hospital at Cortona and the Confraternity of Our Lady of Mercy. She continued to preach against vice and helped many return to the sacraments. She died 1297 at the age of 50, having spend 29 years performing acts of penance. She was canonized in 1728.
