# CHIEF'S REPORT

- Firefighter physicals were completed, 18 firefighters passed, no failures.
- 20 SCBA's were bench tested, all passed.
- All new radios are now received and installed in appropriate trucks.
- The Chief presented numbers comparing savings for the use of 5707 to that of operating 5701 only. During the last six months a 44% savings on mileage is realized.
- A fire training seminar is in the planning stages for November 2011. This would be a statewide service to all interested persons. Each District could shoulder the initial cost which could be estimated at \$20,000 (\$5000 per District). A separate account can be established to cover the financial operating requirements. This would be both general assembly and break out classroom environments. It is possible that Homeland Security funding could be utilized to offset the cost. This program is in the planning stages. More to come.
- Chief introduced a preliminary bid package for all potential bidders for the new planned ladder truck.
- The firehouse SCBA fill station will be difficult to repair and placed back into service, if it can be repaired at all. The equipment is old and parts are hard to come by. Some repairs or replacement parts may be available but are not the best way to go. Our vendor (Advanced Air) will keep an eye out. Station 56 is available to assist with our SCBA bottle needs.
