Rural Fayette County glows with nostalgic communities. Many mailboxes reflect this area's Central European heritage from descendants of Austrians, Germans, Moravians, and Bohemians who immigrated to this area in the 1850's and 1860's to escape the Austro-Hungarian oppression. Most towns had disappeared from the Texas maps years ago but their heritage still lives on.

Holman is picturesquely situated on Pecan Creek, about thirteen miles southeast of La Grange on the La Grange - Weimar Valley road FM 155, two miles distant from the Colorado River in Mullins Prairie. The country is very rich and fertile blackland prairie. The population originally was German, Bohemian, and American with some of the first settlers being G.W Lewis, Nat Holman, Jno. Ossina, Lott Fisher and the Seydler family.

Years ago Holman consisted of two stores, saloons, a blacksmith and wheelwright shop. They had a gin that produced thousands of bales of cotton per year, a postoffice and the store. The store was originally one of the first voting precincts in Fayette County over a 100 years ago.

One of the stores in Holman (as pictured above) was originally called Vacek - Miksch, Holman General Merchandise which is the same building that the current Holman Valley Steakhouse is established. In the early 1900's there was a general store, saloon, pool hall and a dance hall all under one roof.

With a continued effort to keep the tradition, the Holman Valley Steakhouse was owned and operated by fourth generation descendants of the Holman Valley , Judy and David Hajovsky. The Hajovsky family originally immigrated to Texas and the Holman Valley in the early 1880's from Moravia, Czechoslovakia. With their love and support, Wendee Galleymore and staff, now own and operate Holman Valley Steakhouse, and are committed to keeping the tradition alive from generations past to generations future.
