


The province will go Green at midnight on July 30th. This allows us to remove some restrictions in our churches. However, we will have to continue to be careful as Covid-19 is always with us. We are encouraged to practice health measures such as handwashing, or staying home when sick. Parishioners are **NO** longer required to call and register for Mass. Face masks are no longer required, but respect and acceptance must be shown to those who choose to wear them for health or safety reasons. Hand sanitizer will be available for use if you wish. No distancing is required. Singing may be resumed as before Covid-19 without restrictions.

The following restrictions are to be maintained: Holy Communion: For the time being, as a matter of prudence, we will refrain from distributing communion in the cup or receiving on the tongue. The sign of peace will be exchanged by bowing or making other gestures without contact.




A Commentary on transubstantiation taken from the Catechism of the Catholic Church

**1375** It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament. The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the efficacy of the Word of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. Thus St. John Chrysostom declares:

It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered.

And St. Ambrose says about this conversion: Be convinced that this is not what nature has formed, but what the blessing has consecrated. The power of the blessing prevails over that of nature, because by the blessing nature itself is

changed. . . . Could not Christ's word, which can make from nothing what did not exist, change existing things into what they were not before? It is no less a feat to give things their original nature than to change their nature.



1377 The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."

#### **Delegation to the Holy See**

Many people have expressed their sorrow and disappointment to me following the tragic discovery of the remains of many children at former Residential School sites in Western Canada. As with many of you, the pain of such a tragedy has disturbed me and deeply touched me. Since then, many people have rightly called for an explanation and an apology from the Catholic Church.



In search of more significant healing and reconciliation for the future, the CCCB (Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops) announced yesterday that a delegation will travel to Rome to meet Pope Francis from 17 to 20 December 2021. Pope Francis will hold personal meetings with each of the three distinct groups of delegates, First Nations, Métis, and Inuit, and a final audience with all representatives on 20 December 2021. Planning for the delegation is underway, and further details will be provided at a later date.

These meetings will allow Pope Francis to hear directly from representatives of Indigenous peoples in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma. In the 29 June 2021 statement, the CCCB wrote: "The Bishops of Canada reaffirm their sincere hope that these forthcoming encounters will lead to a shared future of peace and harmony between Indigenous Peoples and the Catholic Church in Canada." 


