What did Jesus Drink at the Passover?

M ost of us have read about the Jewish Passover. This feast was followed by the sevenday feast of unleavened bread (Exodus 12:1-20; Numbers 28:16-17). Because these two feasts joined each other, the term "Passover" eventually came to signify both.

This feast is of special interest to Christians. It was during the Passover that Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper (Matt. 26:26-28). Also, leaven is a corrupting agent. The removal

of leaven represented the fact that the sacrifice of Jesus was free from corruption of sin (1 Cor. 5:7).

The Jews were commanded to remove leaven from their homes for this feast. This meant any and all leaven! The Jews understood this. They removed anything that was beginning to ferment or had fermented. They knew that this included <u>liquids</u> as well as dough.

The Mishnah is a record of Jewish practices during and even before the time of Christ. Here is what it says about the Passover:

"These must be removed at Passover: Babylonian porridge, Median beer, Edomite vinegar, and Egyptian barley-beer...dough beginning to ferment must be burnt...dough wholly fermented must be burnt." (Pesahim 3.1,5)

Some social drinkers say that Jesus used alcoholic wine when He instituted the Lord's Supper. This could not have happened! The Jews removed anything fermented from their homes during Passover, whether dough or liquid. The "fruit of the vine" was simply unfermented grape juice.

Our Lord was not a drinker. He never condoned drinking. Let us stand against any such worldly accusation against Him. --Kerry Duke--
