

My View From the Mountain

With Pastor Mary Anderson

Hermon as a supply pastor immediately after Pastor Eric's last Sunday in mid–July and then was officially hired as an interim beginning August 20th. I've walked with you through all the big seasons now except for the unofficial season of Vacation Bible School! I'm looking forward to that week.

The Altar Guild has changed the paraments in our sanctuary to green and they will stay green all through this second half of the Church Year. This is the time of year when we switch our focus from the events of the life of Jesus and instead focus on our own discipleship. Instead of pondering the question: Who is Jesus? we now focus on the question: Who are we as disciples of Jesus?



sessions, and cluster meetings to help us move forward in our vision for ministry. We will inform the congregation all along the way. For this process, our congregation is in a cluster with Nazareth, Lexington, and St. Thomas, Chapin.

Congregational Council Mini Minutes for May 2018

Reports:

Pastor Anderson presented her report for April and May

Emily Morris, Treasurer, submitted her report. Questions from April meeting about errors have been corrected. It was suggested that we set a meeting with Maddison Dye to review funds. It was also suggested that we put together a team to review current contracts, payments, etc to determine any changes needed for savings or consolidation. Finance committee will set this up.

Annette Price, Financial Secretary, submitted a report for March 2018 and the 1st quarter.

Executive Committee: A Thank you note with a donation of \$75 was received from St. Michael's for the use of the church bus.

Board/Committee Reports/Business:

Recent projects include painting, door closures and replacements, and sidewalk repair.

Finance Committee:

Several members are looking into the current envelope cost and alternatives to what we are currently using. We are on track for making our full Synodical payment for this year. So far \$4,000 has been paid towards this amount.

Recommendation 1: Committee has received several quotes on payroll services. Recommended that we contract with Advantage Payroll Services for a cost of \$97.08 per month. This will include direct deposit for employees as well as preparation and filing of tax documents.

PASSED

Recommendation 2: Property Board recommends that Century Glass replace 11 windows, which are cracked, for a cost of \$4, 011.13. Deductible is \$5.000. Finance committee recommended that we

Old Business

- Delegates for Synod assembly will be Pastor Anderson and Cyndi Thurman.
- Call committee has made several visits and conducted interviews. They have one more interview from the original list provided as well as an additional candidate to visit and interview.

New Business

- Two requests have been made for the use of our church bus:
 - 1. SC Synod requests the use of the bus at the assembly on Friday afternoon, June 1st to take participants to various Discipleship Experiences.
 - 2. GraceWorks Youth camp requests the use of the bus to transport participants to service project locations. This would be during the week of July 16–July 20

Both requests passed with understanding that the driver would be supplied by Mt. Hermon.

- Cemetery Committee shared a letter sent by a member of HC Dreher family raising concerns over the condition of the cemetery. It was recommended that the Cemetery committee develop a job description for acceptable upkeep of the cemetery. This will be given to the Property Board to get additional bids on this work. This is to be done by July 1st. Cemetery committee will follow up with HC Dreher family to let them know we are looking into their concerns in this way. Questions were raised as to whether funds are large enough for this to be paid without using the principle. Finance committee will include this fund in the review with Maddison Dye.
- Farming Church event was attended by Pastor Anderson, Terry Swygert, and Rebekah Swygert. 10–12 churches attended this event. Next meeting is May 19th for the churches who have decided to participate. This program is a two year commitment focused on the cultural change in the church, and includes monthly coaching for Pastors, cluster meetings, and webinars. SC Synod is backing this program and paying 2/3 of the cost. Cost for each congregation is \$500 per year. A recommendation was made that council members agree to participate in the program and that funding come from Thrivent funds. **PASSED**
- Use of the Fellowship Hall was requested for Primary voting polls if a June 26 run-off is needed. Joel Price, Sr. is Poll manager and would be present the entire time. **PASSED**
- Revised Cantor contract was presented. A recommendation was made to accept the contract as presented. **PASSED**
