1992 SLOGANS

GOTTA HAVE IT

over the years Pepsi-Cola has developed a reputation for making great tasting cola and producing some of the best advertising campaigns in the world.

So when it was announced that Pepsi-Cola would introduce a new slogan for 1992, the advertising world as well as Pepsi enthusiasts across the country stood by, waiting to see if Pepsi could do it again. Some thought, with a string of advertising successes going back to the 1930's Pepsi was due for a miss. That Pepsi advertising had been so successful in the 1980's, how could they possibly keep it going in the 90's. Well, Pepsi-Cola being the kind of company that loves a "challenge", set about to create an advertising campaign worthy of this fine tradition. The result was "Gotta Have It". A slogan that in just a few short weeks has already become part of the American lexicon.

So, just remember the next time you "Gotta Have It", Pepsi has always been able to "Hit the Spot".



HISTORY OF PEPSI-COLA ADVERTISING SLOGANS:

1909 - 1939: The theme "Delicious and Healthful" gives a lift to Pepsi drinkers by promising extra "pep".

1939-1950: To boost sales, Pepsi offers 12-ounce bottles for a nickel and introduces its "twice as much for a nickel" theme with America's first radio advertising jingle.

1953-1958: To suit changing times and consumer preferences for refreshing, light soft drinks, Pepsi introduces "The Light Refreshment" campaign for more brand-conscious Americans.

1958-1961: The "Be Sociable" campaign identifies fashionable young adults typified in the Joan Crawford era.

1961-1963: Pepsi ads change again to reflect a younger America. "Now It's Pepsi for Those Who Think Young".

1963-1967: The "Come Alive! You're in the Pepsi Generation" campaign links Pepsi to an entire generation with a message for the exciting, active lives of the baby boomers.

"Now that everybody's gotta have it, Pepsi's not gonna need celebrity endorsers anymore." -BO JACESON 1967-1969: Pepsi beats the competition in taste, refreshment and satisfaction with "Taste that Beats the Others Cold. Pepsi Pours It On."

1969-1973: "You've Got a Lot to Live. Pepsi's Got a Lot to Give" is a positive statement of hope for young and old.

1973-1975: "Join the Pepsi People Feelin' Free" says the Pepsi Generation is contemporary and invites consumers to join the carefree, active era of the Flower Child.

1976-1978: Getting back to enjoying the simple things in life -- "Have a Pepsi Day" speaks for the country that wants one great Pepsi Day after another.


1979-1981: In a radical new decade, "Catch that Pepsi Spirit" reflects with pride the optimism of Pepsi people everywhere.

1981-1982: "Pepsi's Got Your Taste for Life!" invites the world to taste the leader -- Pepsi!

1983: In a competitive soft drink atmosphere, "Pepsi Now!" declares that Pepsi has won the taste of America.

1984-1991: "The Choice of a New Generation:" The heart, soul, and beat of the times is captured in popular music. Pepsi takes the leading edge in advertising with sizzling performers like Michael Jackson, Lionel Richie and Tina Turner.

1992: Consumers everywhere have made their choice. It's the big taste of Pepsi. They "Gotta Have It."



One of the highlights of this years Pepsi's television commericals, is the use of baseball legend Yogie Berra. Berra is known for his somewhat unusal quips, that on the surface don't make sense, but after you think about it for awhile it's "pure logic!!".

In the "Gotta Have It" spot with Berra he expounds one of these gems, "If Pepsi's so popular, how come everybody's drinking it?" Think about that one over a nice cold Pepsi, and at the same time drop me a line and let me know which is your favorite new Pepsi and Diet Pepsi commerical.

PEPSI ICE PALACE

epsi and ice have always been a winning combination. But the two have never gone together as magnificently as they did at the 1992 St. Paul Winter Carnival.

The 106 year old St. Paul Winter Carnival transforms the city of St. Paul into a kingdom of ice and snow for twelve days. This year St. Paul wanted to make the Winter Carnival extra special because of the many visitors coming to see Super Bowl XXVI in neighboring Minneapolis. This goal was not only reached but was exceeded with the help of Pepsi-Cola.

Pepsi became the sponsor for the 1992 "Ice Palace" and went about building the "world's largest ice palace". Some of the statistics for the Pepsi ice palace are; 166 ft. 8 inches high, 249 ft. wide, 12 towers of varying heights, built with over 18,000 ice blocks each one weighing 640 pounds, and was lighted by over 400 light fixtures controlled by a computer.

In addition to the ice palace Pepsi also erected a temporary museum of Pepsi memorabilia and old Pepsi television commercials. The museum was open to Winter Carnival visitors. In just eleven days over 65,000 people viewed

the Pepsi displays. Congratulations to all the people at Pepsi Burnsville who made the Pepsi spirit come alive at the 1992 St. Paul Winter Carnival!!


Dear SL:





The Pepsi-Cola trademark is color-debossed on both sides of the pourer, providing advertising flash.

You'll want to supply every Fountain Pepsi-Cola outlet in your territory with at least one—or more—of these pourers. Our supply is limited, so we advise every Bottler to estimate his requirements and place his order immediately.

Important Note Regarding Proper Care of Pourers

For best performance, these pourers must be kept clean at all times. Fountain operators should be instructed to rinse pourers in cold or lukewarm water frequently to prevent clogging. This is important: Boiling water should never be used since it will soften or dissolve the plastic material.

Be sure to instruct dealers to moisten cork in water before using pourer for the first time. This will enable easy removal of pourer from bottle.


