SPANISH VALLEY WATER & SEWER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Regular meeting ----- April 17, 1991

The meeting was called to order by the Treasurer, ATTENDANCE Bud Cunningham, at 7:00 P.M. at the District office. Other Board members present were Dan Holyoak and George White.

Others present were Gary Butt, Tim Keogh, Vaughn Jyurovat, Dale Pierson and Roberta Highland.

Roberta read the minutes of the meeting of March MINUTES 20, 1991. Dale corrected the amount of the grant to read \$417,500.00. Dan moved the minutes be approved as amended. George seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Bud opened the public hearing, and asked for com- PUBLIC HEAR-After the public present voiced their approval, Dan ING ON C.I.B. moved to apply to the C.I.B. for a grant. George seconded. GRANT APPLI-MOTION CARRIED.

CATION

Tim Keogh reported he and Dan had viewed the PROPOSED property in question, and presented a plat of the parcels of PROPERTY land. Dale reported he had received complaints from Lloyd EXCHANGE Pierson and Ber Knight to a pumping station at that site because of the noise. Noise reduction was discussed, and it was pointed out that any building housing a pump would reduce noise. Dan moved to trade the property with Keogh. The proposed line to Norman's proposed subdivision was discussed and the reasons for a trade (our commitment to Bob Norman to provide culinary water to his proposed subdivision in Navajo Heights) was discussed. Dan pointed out the acreage that would be traded was the same, and we will need a property to provide a pumping station to provide culinary water for anticipated growth in the area. After a discussion, Dale suggested the entire Board view the properties involved and make a decision at that time. The chair tabled the proposal until the entire Board can view the property and make a decision.

Gary Butt has bought 2 acres next to the District GARY BUTT Office and is looking for a way to bring sewer to this SEWER CON-property. He suggested we could bring a sewer line from NECTION Nuevo Court. They have surveyed a possible route; 1500' of pipe would be required at an estimated cost of \$16,000. and the District would have to get a right-of-way through Winbourn's or Batchelder's property and from the Cemetery District. It was pointed out this cost was not budgeted for, and there are only two current customers, the District and Butt. There is a potential of serving more customers in the future. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to table the project until further information surfaces. After further discussion, it was suggested that Gary hook into the District septic tank if there is no sewer available by the

time he builds his house, and he would pay the monthly fee of \$13.90. It was agreed by consensus that this would be a viable solution until a sewer line is available.

GARY BUTT (Cont.)

The financial statements for January, February and March were discussed and accepted.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Dale reported that the sewer in Cottonwood Subdivi- SEWER BACKsion backed up into two houses, Dowd's and Walston's. City crew unplugged the sewer main. He has since heard rumors that M.I.C. water had entered the sewer in vast amounts and had backed up. He had looked at the supposed location, and could see no evidence of such fact. Our insurance adjuster has denied District responsibilities, and there is a possibility of a lawsuit. After a question, Dale reported he has had the manhole where water had supposedly entered the line raised. After further discussion, Dale suggested that when this is all over, we might have a crew come in and run a TV camera through the line to see if there is something physical causing this problem, since this is the second time in 8 years this has happened to these two Dan asked that he and Dale investigate the area houses. with the adjuster tomorrow.
