

Chapter 3: Re-Branding the substance of engagement

What is essential here is that we have a group of solid pioneers who comprehend engagement. Rethinking fatherhood engagement is to reconsider a fathers' value. Fathers need better attention, better publicity! What merits centering our consideration on are the genuine fathers who are doing it correctly. When I think about the men in my own life that I admire, including relatives, and even acquaintances. It is the unsung champions of fatherhood who stand tall despite the circumstances. It is the men who are not crazy, egotistical, oppressive, brutal, foolish, lethargic, con-artists, and addicts. My attention on deliberately announcing this positive re-branding of fatherhood engagement is for the men who are now driving the way.

The principal thing we have to comprehend is that policymakers condemn failing schools and advance a wide mixture of potential changes, from more control in schools with police and security and less impact from parents that have any significant impact on fewer children in the classrooms. While there appears to be no agreement on the most ideal approach to change instruction, escalate projects that get parents buy in before their kids are even prepared to begin school and backing those kids through secondary school and expand future possibilities for at risk children.

The second thing we need to help parents comprehend is that the family must be developed like a garden. with time, effort, and creative energy. A family must be summoned continually to keep it blossoming. There is no greater challenge more noteworthy than child rearing. If you talk with your kids you can help them to keep their lives together. If you talk with them skillfully, you can help them to assemble future dreams starting with self-care.

In those conversations' children must be assured that they are loved. The love must be communicated in the love languages of children. They are physical touch, words of encouragement, quality time, gifts, and acts of service. If we understand that this is what our children need to be emotionally, and spiritually well rounded and this is what children are craving from their parents, then why are we not providing more of these types of points of service to our families? I believe that is because the government does not make huge profits from healing families or else it would not make sense to having this discussion.
