Downtown Bike Station will help encourage more people to ride

Hutchinson Publik Bike Station: Below: Randall said that Hutchinson's first public bike check out station hopefully will be open by June, located on the north side of Fire Station No. 1 at Avenue B and Walnut Street. There will also be a 24-hour air and tool station located outside the building. - Sandra J. Milburn/The Hutchinson News

Jennifer Randall and Dan Brizendine are back at it, trying to pump some air into the tires of a movement to get more people riding bicycles in Hutchinson.

By June, they hope to open a Public Bike Station in a garage at the back of Fire Station No. 1 at Avenue B and Walnut, with seven to 10 new bicycles available to check out and ride for free, parts available at cost for those needing to repair their own bike and a 24-hour air and tool station.

Although the bikes will still be free to ride, the Bike Station will require borrowers to show identification or swipe a credit card to create some accountability and incentive to return the bikes, she said.

"The earlier concept I wanted to be this, but it was all I could do then," she said. "It was kind of fun and whimsical. But it was always just part of the conversation about more bikes and trails. This is the evolution of what we started four years ago." (this was just excerpt of article)

Cosmosphere will lend Liberty Bell 7 for exhibit in Germany Full article: (Hutch News)

Gus Grissom's Liberty Bell 7 space capsule, one of the iconic exhibits at the Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center, is going on a six-month journey to Germany, where it will become a part of the "Outer Space: The Space Between Art and Science" at the Art and Exhibition Hall of the Federal Republic of Germany in Bonn. But before Liberty Bell 7 begins its latest journey, the Cosmosphere on May 10 will open a bon voyage exhibit titled "A New Flight Path for Liberty Bell 7," which promises a look at the personal side of Grissom's 15-minute suborbital space flight in 1961, including survival gear, medical equipment and personal items Grissom had on board for souvenirs for himself and his family.

After Liberty Bell 7 splashed down in the Atlantic Ocean, Grissom scrambled from the Mercury spacecraft, which then sank. The artifacts that will make up the display were still on board when Liberty Bell 7 was recovered by the Cosmosphere's SpaceWorks team and the Discovery Channel in 1999.

SpaceWorks spent the next six months painstakingly restoring the spacecraft for a national tour.

Liberty Bell 7 has been at home at the Cosmosphere for the past eight years.


In August, it will be packed up for shipment to Germany. Liberty Bell 7 will debut in the Bonn exhibit Oct. 3 and remain on display there through Feb. 22, 2015, at which time it will be packed up again for return to Hutchinson.

"Liberty Bell 7 is, without question, one of the most iconic pieces of the Cosmosphere's collection," said Cosmosphere CEO Richard Hollowell. "This piece has a very special place in the hearts of our staff and our community. Part of the Cosmosphere's mission involves sharing the wonders of the universe with the world, and as we prepare to send Liberty Bell to Germany, we know that her journey will serve to honor the rich history of the space program and inspire the next generation.



<u>Former county attorney, lawmaker inducated into Hall of Fame</u> WINFIELD –

A former Hutchinson attorney and state lawmaker is one of three people Southwestern College will induct next week into its Hall of Fame for the leaders in the Social Sciences.

Harry Dunn will be inducted posthumously, with his daughter, Mary, of Denver, and son, John, of Miami, accepting the award.

Other inductees are Bruce Blake, a bishop of the United Methodist Church in Dallas and Oklahoma, and Pedro M. Esquivel, a civil rights pioneer and one of the first staff members of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

The ceremony will begin 5:30 p.m. Friday, in Deets Library on the college's campus, with unveiling of plaques, followed by dinner and the induction ceremony.

Dunn, class of 1923, was a participant in some of his generation's most pivotal political moments, according to a release from the college.

Born in 1899 in Abbyville, he toured Europe on a Pilgrimage of Friendship in 1923, and was in Germany when Hitler wrote "Mein Kampf." He was a teacher, principal, and coach at Bucklin High School, then earned his law degree from the University of Chicago.

Dunn was Reno County Attorney during World War II, before elected to two terms in the Kansas Legislature, in 1949 and 1951. There he authored Kansas laws concerning living trusts. Long active in the Republican Party, Dunn was a delegate to the 1964 national convention in San Francisco.

When his son was a prisoner of war in Vietnam, Dunn represented the National League of Families and met with President Nixon and Henry Kissinger.

Harry died in 2004, at age 104.

Demolition has been delayed because of high winds they have been unable to remove debris to continue demolition.


End Project to be done by years end with 73 apts. & penthouse will be on the upper 7 floors and Commercial space on the lower level!
