<u>**Club Meetings.**</u> The next club meeting will be at the Paul Bunyan Clubhouse on <u>*Thursday, 11 December 2014*</u> at 6:00 pm. It will be the annual Christmas Party. **Upcoming Shoot and Fundraiser**. The next monthly shoot will be the Christmas shoot on Sunday, December 21st. In lieu of a shooter's fee we will be <u>collecting donations</u> (monetary) at check in for our annual contribution to the Toys for Tots campaign.

**Paul Bunyan Rifle and Sportsmen's Club**. Mark Curtis reported that 2 of the 4 meetings on the concept of the new clubhouse have been conducted. It is looking like a 5,500 sf, 2 story facility with classrooms. The construction will clear up many existing building code issues. It is estimated at \$800,000 to \$900,000. Portables will be used for the clubhouse during construction. The goal is to have it finished by 27 Apr 16 when the club is 70 years old.

**Initiative 594.** I-594 passed, but will not affect muzzleloaders as they are considered "antique" guns and are not covered under the new provisions for background checks. The NRA will likely get involved in helping to fight the constitutionality of the measure. It will affect hunter education.

**November Turkey Shoot**. The Turkey shoot was held on Sunday, November 23rd. Twenty shooters braved the torrential downpour to make it to the range. Once the shooters meeting began, the rain tapered off. The course of fire was three paper targets for 5 shots each; a large turkey, small turkey, and tweety bird gong for 1 shot at 10 points each, and a small pumpkin for one shot and 10 points. Even though our Booshway, Karla Hillberg, had the match well orchestrated, she was no match for Mother Nature. The course of fire was modified to 2 paper targets as one of them

disintegrated on the wet target frames, and the tweety bird gong was eliminated after it was blown away by a well placed shot. When the smoke cleared, the results were:
