Let Everything Praise The Lord


Psalm 103

Simply titled "a psalm of David" doesn't mean that it was written by David. This hymn is one of the greatest praise psalms in the entire collection. The first section (verses 1-5), finds the psalmist expressing his intention to praise God for all "his **benefits**" (verse 2). Then with five verbs he identifies specifically these benefits: "who **forgives** ... who **heals**" (verse 3), "who **redeems** ... who **crowns**" (verse 4)," who **satisfies**" (verse 5). All of these actions speak of <u>spiritual blessings</u>, though physical benefits may be included. The next section (verses 6-19), which speaks of **God's character**, contains an inventory of the generous attributes of God: "**compassionate**, **gracious**, **slow to anger**, **abounding in love**" (verse 8). These are illustrated in an attempt to express their vastness: the greatness of His **compassion** ("*as far as the east is from the west*"; verse 12), and the greatness of His **compassion** ("*as a father compassion on his children*"; verse 13). Finally, in the conclusion the psalmist returns to the call that he gave himself at the beginning, but this time he expands it to include all created beings and works (verses 20-22).

 - a) What does this section say about God's Lordship?
 - b) How does this section compare to Philippians 2:9-11?
