C. Consider and Discuss Ordinance No. 0-2023-09

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 13-24 "DESIGNATION OF STOP INTERSECTIONS" OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, DESIGNATING TWO-WAY STOP INTERSECTION AT BEECH STREET AND EAST 23RD STREET; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (First Reading)

Mayor Forester stated that the ordinance was presented as requested by Councilmember C. Johnson. The Council discussed the benefits of adding the stop intersection as a traffic control device. Chief Preston indicated that by making traffic stop both ways on Beech, the city could not also maintain E. 23rd Street as a yield intersection, saying it could only be a two-way or four-way stop intersection.

D. Consider and Discuss Ordinance No. 0-2023-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS PROVIDING THAT 167 FEET, OF THE 20 FOOT ALLEY, BEGINNING ON THE WEST LINE OF AVENUE N, WITHIN BLOCK 102, AND BETWEEN W. 12TH STREET AND W. 13TH STREET IN S/D 2 OT, CITY OF CISCO, EASTLAND, COUNTY, TEXAS, BE CLOSED, VACATED AND ABANDONED, EXCEPT FOR EXISTING UTILITY AND/OR DRAINAGE EASEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR REVERSION OF THE FEE IN SAID LAND; AND, PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON FINAL PASSAGE. (First Reading)

Mr. Archer said that the property owners requested this abandonment. The Council inquired about utilities in the easement to which Mr. Archer stated that the city does not abandon utilities with these actions.
