VA Releases Hospital Performance Ratings for 2018

The Roudebush VA Medical Center received a 3 out of 5 stars rating for 2018 which is an improvement. Fort Wayne received a 2 out of 5 which was better than 2017. Eighteen received 5 star ratings, the best possible. Four of them were located in Pennsylvania. Located in West Lafayette, Indiana, the Indiana Veterans' Home (IVH) offers long-term skilled nursing care, short-term rehabilitation, independent living, and memory care services to honorably discharged Indiana veterans and their spouses. New in 2018, IVH is now accepting Gold Star parents!

With a comprehensive array of on-site services offered in a newly renovated home-like setting along with veteran-specific programming and events, IVH is the best choice for Hoosier veterans and their spouses. Effective October 1, 2017, the current rate to reside in comprehensive care at IVH is \$361.48 per day. The independent living rate (domiciliary) is \$138.00 per day. IVH accepts Medicare A, Medicaid, private insurance and private payment. IVH will assist residents in applying for any services they may qualify for to assist with payment. Additionally, IVH participates in the Veteran's Administration higher per diem program and special benefits are available for veterans with a service connected disability rating of 70% or higher.

Blue Water Navy Bill Sinking in Senate Despite Late Hour Talks

As many as 90,000 ailing "Blue Water Navy" Veterans are likely to have to wait for a new Congress to see legislation passed that would make them eligible for Agent Orange related disability compensation and VA paid health care. The negotiations exposed a deepening desire among Senate Republicans to impose tighter controls on creating presumptions or service connection between certain exposures, including herbicides sprayed in Vietnam and diseases of Veterans involved in past or future wars. Battle lines are forming over whether Congress and past Department of Veterans Affairs secretaries have gone too far in building lists of conditions that VA presumes are linked to toxins, burn pits and battlefield environments. Under current law, a VA secretary can add an ailment to VA's presumptive list if the National Academy of Medicine confirms either a "limited or suggestive" association between exposure and disease or a "sufficient" association. If, as expected, the Blue Water Navy bill sinks in the Senate, Republicans are likely to keep its fate in the next Congress tied to their desire to strengthen the science behind presumptions of service connected exposures. 
