The first day of summer finds the Post 171 baseball season is well underway as we approach the mid-point of the summer baseball experience.

Our Senior Legion team, under tutelage of Coach Bob O’Conor and his staff, is playing exceptionally well and at this point boasts an impressive 7 – 1 record; their only loss coming in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning at the hands of rival Laurel Post 60. Collectively, they have relied on solid defensive play and timely hitting enroute to winning 3 of their 7 wins by 10 or more runs. Leading the offensive on-slaught, Matt Danis, Jake Paholski, and Will Proctor have provided the long ball threat. Post 171 has fielded one of the best, if not the best, outfield in the Montgomery County Legion League with Manny Engermann, Matt Magliozzi, and Will Proctor tracking down balls in the outfield. On the hill, Jason Moyer leads a solid pitching staff. Over the June 24<sup>rd</sup> weekend, the team travels to Florence, SC, for the Palmetto Invitational Tournament and will follow-up with the Frederick Wood-Bat Tournament over the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend. In both tournaments, the Senior players will face exceptionally strong competition.

A very pleasant surprise this season has been the improved performance of our Junior Legion team under the management of first-year Legion coach, Brett Daly. With 14 returning veterans, including 6 who have three years of Junior Legion experience, the Junior Legion team has posted an overall record of 7 – 4 (5 – 3 in Western District league play). In the Sonny Blank tournament, our team took 2 of 3 games. Offensively, Zack Walker has lead the charge at the plate, while defensively the infield of Matt Martin, Connor Manion, Nate Proctor, Luke Trythall, and Tyler Retherford have played solid, fundamental baseball. On the mound, Bradley Jamison, Bryan Jamison, Bailey Ingalla, and Ethan Wentzlaff have turned-in outstanding pitching performances.

A new addition to our program has been the inclusion of 17U and 16U Showcase Teams composed mostly of our in-house Post 171 Legion players. Both teams were in action at the Dynamic Showcase Tournaments at Virginia Tech and the University of Maryland. The 16U team will play in their final tournament at the University of Virginia over June 24<sup>th</sup> weekend. Both teams have faced the region’s best competition and have played very well in their inaugural seasons.

Although inclement weather twice prevented us from playing the Bob Bellison Red, White, and Blue Baseball Game, we held the picnic at the Legion Post on June 21<sup>st</sup> to honor Bob Bellison and to recognize our baseball boosters, coaches, and players and their families. With approximately 85 in attendance, we had a great evening together as we recognized Bob for his decades of service and support to our youth and our baseball program.

On July 7<sup>th</sup>, we will host a special bingo event at the Legion Post for our baseball program. This fundraiser helps us to provide a quality but yet affordable baseball experience for our players and their families. We encourage you to make plans to please come and enjoy a family friendly experience. All proceeds generated will benefit the Post 171 baseball program.

## Damascus American Legion Celebrates Memorial Day

On Saturday, May 28<sup>th</sup>, Damascus American Legion members placed American Flags on the graves of 604 veterans in twenty cemeteries in the greater Damascus community. Organized and led by Sandy Seipp, daughter of Past Post #171 Commander John Seipp and Past President of Auxiliary Unit #171, this annual ceremonial activity serves to set the tone for the Memorial Day service held traditionally on the Sunday before Memorial Day.

Early in the afternoon on Sunday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, about 200 people gathered on the lawn of Post #171 in Damascus to honor fallen veterans at the Post's annual Memorial Day service. Boy Scout Troop #1397 had erected tents to shade the attendees, and they delivered bottles of water to help keep them cool. Following a long-standing tradition, the Browningsville Cornet Band provided a half-hour concert as a prelude to the service.

Post Commander Kevin Mook, a career Navy veteran, now retired, led the service. Color guards from the Post and Auxiliary Unit presented United States and organizational colors, and the Boy Scouts raised the United States flag under prescribed protocol. Following recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, Captain Sherry Hohl of the Montgomery County Fire and Rescue Service sang The National Anthem beautifully, and Post Chaplain Shawn Gill delivered a meaningful invocation.

Eleven members of Auxiliary Unit #171 then presented individual American flags honoring each Post member who had transferred to Post Everlasting since Memorial Day 2015, and nineteen organizations from the greater Damascus community placed floral tributes at the veterans' memorial monument. Then, the Montgomery County Police Pipers played a stirring and memorable rendition of "Amazing Grace."

The guest speaker for the ceremony was veteran and Post member Fred Carlini, a US Navy corpsman who served for almost a year in the military hospital in DaNang during the Vietnam War. Fred's inspirational message included a tribute to those veterans who died in wartime and after serving our nation.

The service closed with the singing of "God Bless America," a moment of silence followed by a 21-gun salute by the firing squad from Rockville Legion Post #86, and the moving playing of "Echo Taps" by two Boy Scouts from a Northern Virginia Troop.

Following the service, Unit #171 served a tasty luncheon to those attending.

Created in 1917, the Blue Star Banner is a symbol of recognition of families whose sons and daughters are currently serving with the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard.

Blue star banners were presented to Fred and Patricia Busche, whose son Sam is an Army second lieutenant now in officers' training at Fort Benning, Georgia; J.B. Weeks, whose son Army Captain Lucas is a Ranger School instructor at Fort Benning; Scott and Maria Earnhardt, whose daughter Gabrielle is a Navy Seaman E3 serving on board the USS HUE CITY CG66 in May Port, Florida; and Traci and Bernie Moxley, Junior, whose daughters— Army First Lieutenant Kailey Moore and Army Second Lieutenant Morgan Moxley—serve, respectively, in the 391st Engineer Battalion in Greenville, South Carolina, and the 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Kailey is an Army Reservist, who, when not serving, teaches high school biology in Saluda, North Carolina. Morgan is a platoon leader in Company E of the Apache Reconnaissance Battalion.

The Moxleys received a two-star banner. On behalf of Post 171, the Blue Star Banners were presented by Past Post Commander George Bolling and Past First Vice Commander Keith Midberry, and they will hang in the front windows of the honorees' homes.
