Greetings Puckety family & friends! *As I write this*, I notice on my calendar we are one week away from turning the page to September (and as *you read it*, we're probably THERE!). I'm excited and a bit anxious too! In my heart is a mixture of *anticipation* for the heightened ministry and activity that comes with the fall, combined with the *caution/anxiety* over the current health concerns related to the surge in new COVID cases, the Delta variant, etc. And, of course, there are well-intentioned people on both sides with very strong opinions, who I want to listen to. I suppose the main thing I want to ask from everybody is: *grace and patience*. I know that sounds like asking for more of the same, and I'll be honest enough to admit that continuing to foster those two virtues is HARD! But it's one of the chief ways we prove our trust in God and our commitment to each other as sisters and brothers in Christ. So, there may at times seem to be conflicting

emphases (between health precautions and ministry activity), but you and I are called to both.

So: 1) *do* your due diligence to research from reliable sources the best ways to promote communal health and prayerfully consider the best ways to encourage those among others, in a way that doesn't alienate but at least gets them to think in different ways, etc.

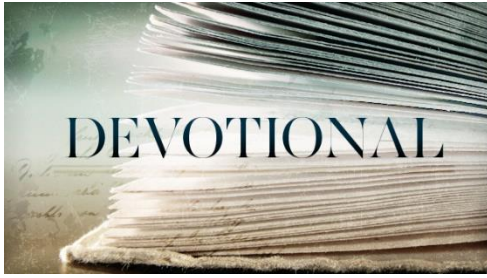
2) *don't* hesitate to get involved in the Christ's ministry through Puckety that is "ready to go" -
*Youth group – we are unable to promote in some of the "traditional" ways – for example, we can't *directly* communicate through the schools to the students – SO, we need your help to get the word out to the middle & high school students/families. Take some flyers for the **Sept. 19th** kickoff and post them in well-trafficked areas, distribute them to people who can "talk it up" – and of course, the tried-and-true method of "word of mouth" to the relevant neighbors and acquaintances.

A Devotional for you – Read Matthew 5:43-48

(twice, slower the second time)

In the wake of the Taliban taking control over Afghanistan in recent weeks, there are many thoughts running through everyone's minds. The world is on edge, fearful of what this could mean or lead to. But no one is more fearful than those who are currently stuck in the unsettled country,

tormented between trying to get out and staying to try and make things better. Those who have converted from Islam to Christianity in Afghanistan face the fear of persecution and even death at the hands of the Taliban. According to Open Doors, which ranks [Afghanistan](#) *second* on its "[World Watch List](#)" of nations that persecute Christians, the country "is a brutal place for the Church." In the nation of 38 million, the number of Christians isn't known, partly because "it is impossible to live openly as a Christian" there. The people of Afghanistan need our prayers right now. But in addition to them, we must lift up prayers for our brave troops, interpreters, leaders, and missionaries who are facing this fear head-on as well. Lastly, and this is *directly in line with Jesus' teaching to us*, we can pray for the members of the Taliban, that the Holy Spirit would work in their hearts. Here are 5 prayers to guide you in your praying and lifting up of Afghanistan (*you could use them all today, or use one each day this week*):

A Prayer for the People of Afghanistan

Lord, we lift up the people of Afghanistan to you right now. We pray that you would take hold of them and help them walk through this fearful time. Protect them under your wing and help them feel the comfort and peace that only comes from your powerful presence. We pray particularly for the women and girls who are increasingly vulnerable to abuse and harm. So many people who have called this place their home have been displaced, scattered, made refugees, or gone into hiding. Remind them, Lord, that their true home is in Heaven with you (and remind *us* of that too, Lord). Give those who believe in you the courage to stand strong in their faith and be a peace-filled witness for you. Also, be with those who do not believe in you – help them to see the peace in your followers and allow the Holy Spirit to stir in their hearts as they witness this. *So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. "All who rage against you will surely be ashamed and disgraced; those who oppose you will be as nothing and perish. Though you search for your enemies, you will not find them. Those who wage war against you will be as nothing at all. ([Isaiah 41:10-12](#))*

A Prayer for the Troops and Their Loved Ones

Lord, we lift up the military troops that are in or being deployed to Afghanistan. Protect them as they give up their safety to protect us. Thank you that we live in a free country, where the choice can be made to fight for this freedom. Thank you for every single person who has dedicated their lives to protecting this nation and people, as well as the people of other nations. Help them evacuate people with safety and be a source of hope to those feeling trapped and afraid. We thank them for their sacrifice – a sacrifice that you are so familiar with – because you proved forever the power of love through sacrifice. *No weapon forged against you will prevail, and you will refute every tongue that accuses you. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and this is their vindication from me," declares the Lord. ([Isaiah 54:17](#))*

A Prayer for the Leaders

Lord, we lift up our leaders, both here and abroad, who are tasked with making difficult decisions. It's easy for a country's citizens to judge and criticize. Help those in authority to not lose focus, but give them the clarity to approach each decision with wisdom and care. We know that being a leader in this situation would be no easy task – give us understanding and patience for their decisions, even when we may not agree with them. Each leader was placed in their position for a reason, and we pray that you would guide them to choose what is best for the troops helping, as well as the citizens looking for help. Give our leaders humility and knowledge to negotiate and deliberate. Help them ultimately look to you for guidance, and allow the Holy Spirit to nudge them to pray over each decision that is made. *If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. ([James 1:5](#))*

A Prayer for Missionaries and Those from Other Countries Lord, we pray for the missionaries as well as those visiting Afghanistan right now. We thank you for the brave women and men who leave their comfortable homes here to minister and serve lost people in other countries. There is always a risk in doing anything outside of your comfort zone, but these missionaries stand up to those risks in order to further the gospel. We pray that you would not only protect them but that you would do amazing things through them in the midst of this. Help them to be a light in the darkness for you – to spread your comfort, peace, and assurance to those who are afraid. Let their witness spread to everyone around them. And if need be, give them the courage and strength to defend your name under persecution. *The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them. Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him. Fear the Lord, you his holy people, for those who fear him lack nothing.* (Psalm 34:7-9)

A Prayer for the Taliban Lord, even when it doesn't make sense to our earthly selves, you call us to pray for those who persecute (Matthew 5:44). This command is hard, but we can't get around it. We lift up the Taliban to you today. We pray that your Holy Spirit would work in them, to soften and convict their hearts. Only you truly know their hearts, Lord. You know their whole story. Help us to remember that as their Creator, you love them deeply, and as the Redeemer God, you want them back. Help us to desire the restoration of their hearts, not only for the subsequent welfare for their fellow citizens & country, but for the increase of your covenant family in Christ. You alone can work in their hearts and minds, and we pray that through this process we see the growth of your Church in Afghanistan, knowing that you came to save each and every one of us. *"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.* (Matthew 5:43-44)

We know that, ultimately, God is sovereign over all things. No matter what wars are being waged, won, or lost here on earth, God will have the victory in the end. It's hard for us to see this reality while we live through fearful and uncertain events. But by turning our eyes to God and lifting up our fears and desires to him, we can truly know that he is in control.

Lift up these prayers this week for God's protection over the people of Afghanistan, the troops, and the leaders. Also pray that God would transform the hearts of the Taliban, that they might see his love and glory, and choose peace. There is perhaps nothing more powerful that we can do right now as believers than to pray.

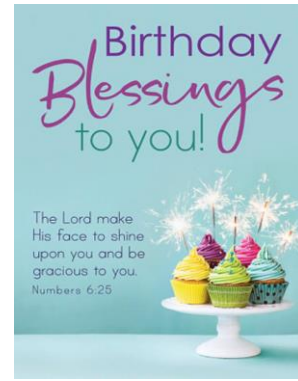

We plan on having a ***Game & Pizza Night*** to kick-off our youth group on *Sunday, Sept. 19th (6 – 8 PM)* – for students ages 12 to 18. Youth Group Missionaries Come to Puckety

On July 29th Puckety Church was blessed with a special opportunity. Pastor Brian had been contacted a month earlier about having a group of young people come to our church to spend a day to do volunteer work at and around the church. The teenagers came from two separate Christian organizations, six of them came from a local sister, Redemption Church church in Lower Burrell, led by their youth leader Marty. The second group of 5 was from Annapolis, Maryland who were doing a week of Christian mission worker in our local area, led by their leader Mark. They worked from 9 am until approximately 2:30 pm. They were a very nice group of young people. They demonstrated the type of character and Christian ethics that we wish for in our future generation.

It was a unique out reach opportunity for them and for us. Puckety Church had many jobs that needed addressed that met the skill set of young people. Their skill set for their age is generally is some raw muscle power topped off with a great deal of enthusiasm. The campus of our church came alive as 11 young people attacked their assigned projects under a continuous day of threatening skies. The day was dull and drab with an occasional soft drizzle, but the young folks were not discouraged from doing their tasks.

Members of the Upkeep Committee along with Pastor Brian provided on site supervision. They were able to accomplish numerous tasks. A list of their jobs included painting both sheds, painting the lower drive way side deck of the church, weeding and clearing debris from all the rock beds around the church and driveways, weeding the rock beds and general clearing of branches from the cemetery, washing and cleaning of all the lower level windows of the church and Faith Hall, removing of the vegetation block on the old play ground area, trimming dead branches from the small trees in front of the church. We greatly appreciated their dedicated efforts on our church's behalf. Thanks to the leaders and the young people for a good day of hard work.
