
Only He Gets The Glory The Hasty Family Update Spring 2015

Even with a change in cooks, the numbers of meals served at The Lord's Café continues to grow. Currently, we are serving one hundred twenty people on an average day. The eleven o'clock rush remains the craziest part of the day. Most days, we average seventy plates the first hour of serving.

Spiritual battles rage on most days. The other Wednesday, I faced the greatest challenge of my ministry. Just before serving, one man who volunteers from community detailed a plan for revenge against several individuals in the area. During the process of sharing, he made it clear he was willing to lose his life in the process. Fortunately, the situation defused by the end of lunch. Please continue pray for this man. He is not a believer. There is much more to this situation that cannot be explained here. I am thankful for crisis management classes at NOBTS.


The food give-away continues as we complete 2 years over the Memorial Day weekend of receiving this incredible donation from Walmart. Each week, the bulk of our fresh food and meat we prepare comes

from this donation. In addition, each volunteer "shops" one day a week, and community comes to "shop" one day a week per household. Each week, we average 80 families at the food give-away. So how important is this donation

India

Harrison and I had an incredible time in India. We had a great time in the Jaipur by ourselves for four days at the end of the trip. Our partnership is now including the district of Jodhpur and not just one people group. While we were there, we saw how the house church movement is rapidly growing throughout Rajasthan! On the walls of the training center, circles are filling up space. Each circle represents a new church work at various stages of development. We traveled to the focus city of Jodhpur. There we met with a couple of local pastors and believers to begin building a relationship to continue work. We spent two days in teaching and worship with these believers. One day, we visited a home where only one man is a believer. He gathered his extended family to come and hear some stories from us. It was an awesome experience to see the father of the family receive a Bible in his language

the family receive a Bible in his language and to hear him read God's Word for the first time. We are praying for this believer and his family.

Another day, we were with our host visiting shops individuals they are building relationships with. Down this one alley, there are many shops craving idols. We visited with a father and his two adult sons. While we were there, they were given a micro SD card with the Bible, Bible lessons, Christian music, and the Jesus Film. We set among marble craving of gods watching these three men getting

introduced to the one true God. Our prayer is for this family to move from creating, selling, and worshiping gods to worshiping the one true God that loves them.

We are excited to already be praying, thinking and planning the next trip to Jodhpur. The goal set for this district is 100,000 believers by 2017. This is a possible God!
