When Are Christians To Partake of the Lord's Supper?

Sadly, many people accept, without question, what their denominations teach rather than what the Bible teaches. This would not be so serious if it were not true that we shall all be judged by the Bible (John 12:48). This is true of many subjects, including baptism, women's roles in the church, mechanical instruments of music, and even when we are to partake of the Lord's Supper.

Some teach that we are to partake of the Lord's Supper monthly, quarterly, semiannually, or annually, even though the Bible does not authorize any of these times. Some people teach that we can partake of the Lord's Supper at a wedding on Thursday night or at other special occasions on any and every day of the week. But, do not be deceived. The Bible authorizes none of these either (Col. 3:17; Gal. 1:8-9; II John 9-11).

What Does the Bible Teach? Christians are taught in the Bible to partake of the Lord's Supper every first day of the week (or every Sunday) and only on Sunday (or the first day of the week). Let us study and act to show ourselves approved unto God (II Tim. 2:15). In Matthew 28:18, after His resurrection (Mk. 16:9) Jesus said He had been given "all authority in heaven and in earth." Before His ascension, He told His apostles to teach and baptize believers by His authority. He then commanded the apostles, "Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world" (Mt. 28:20). This they did after they had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and had done "many wonders and signs" to convince their hearers their message was from heaven (Acts 2:1-4, 43).

The apostles taught those baptized believers what they were to practice in worship when the church was established on Pentecost - the first day of the week, or Sunday. They taught early Christians to continue "steadfastly... in breaking of bread" (Acts 2:41). These early Christians who were under the direction of inspired men, partook "steadfastly," but when? Every first day of the week (Acts 20:7). This will also be true of all who follow the authority of Christ today (I Cor. 11: 1).

SUFFERING FOR FORGIVEN SINS

Forgiveness is not a denial of a deed, but a removing of the penalty of sin. At the risk of oversimplification, let us clarify this point. When a person is forgiven, it is not the case that his past actions really never occurred. They did occur. Furthermore, the sins in which we once participated may have lasting consequences. (We may still have to go to jail, not get our job back, or be able to regain our family. Some things may be lost to us.) But we can rest assured that though we may bear the scar of sin for life, we do not have to bear the penalty of sin. We should not equate the physical suffering brought on by our sin with our spiritual relationship with God. It just may be that some will think that God never has really forgiven them because they are still suffering from some lasting consequence of their sin. Because we may have a strong hatred for our past sins, we may want all things to be as if we never committed the sins, but this cannot be. Forgiveness does not erase the past and deny that the action ever took place. Forgiveness admits the sin and then removes the penalty for the sin. We can be bathed in the comforting truth that we can be as clean and pure, having our sins forgiven, with a clean heart, as one who has never sinned. We can hold our heads high and honestly say, "I am not like that any more!" This is not a denial that we were once a sinner, but a denial that we still serve sin.
