A New Start...

Genesis 12:1-2 "The LORD had said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing."

We are at the end of Fall. I guess we are at the corner of winter. Facing the new season of our lives, I want us to get a fresh new start and push it forward to the end of this year. A story of Abram gives us good insight for this.

God asked Abram to leave his place, his friends and his family. Reading this passage, a few things came into my mind. Abram was seventy-five at the time of the calling, and comfortably lived his life in his father's homeland. I was wondering, why did God ask him to leave everything behind? Why didn't God bless Abram in his hometown where he had already settled his life?

Abram lived in a city named Ur, which was in the country of Chaldea, known today as Iraq. This city was not far from where Nimrod tried to build the city of Babel with its tall tower. The people of the land worshiped idols. Like all of Adam's offspring, Abraham was born in the darkness of sin. Abram's father, Terah did not know the true God and neither did Abram. In order to make him a great blessing to all nations, God had to relocate him in a new place. It was necessary for Abram to refresh his life, and see God and His plan from the new start.

I'm not saying that we must move geographically into a new place; but, emotional newness is needed for a new beginning. It is making yourself ready for the next project.

Following God requires us to discern His spiritual guidance. And the discernment entails our effort of renewing our mindset and our new attitude toward the Lord and ourselves. What we accomplished in the past is not as important as what we do today and will do tomorrow. God gives us a new project every day from a small thing to a bigger one. Every day is a new day, because God wants to lead us to a new level of life.

Thus, the Lord might ask you to take your mind off of what you're holding, and take a step toward a challenge. It could be risky to leave something behind that you already settled. But, you will be amazed by God's blessing followed by your obedience to His callings.





Thoughts for the Journey—How We Worship...

THE WORSHIP OF GOD IS THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH AND CENTER OF OUR LIFE TOGETHER IN THE CHURCH. The Westminster Shorter Catechism affirms that our chief end in life is "to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." This places the worship of God at the very center of what it means to be God's people and makes worship the highest expression we can render to our God-given humanity. Christian worship is a corporate act of the people of God where we gather to realize God's presence and respond with praise to God's gift of love to us in Jesus Christ.

The next several months this column will focus individual acts of worship that take place each Sunday.

THE PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S WORD

- 11. **THE CHILDREN'S MESSAGE**—provides an important time each week for the younger children of our congregation to spend a choice learning period with an adult Christian leader. The theme for the children's time is often reflecting what is being done that day in Worship.
- 12. **THE ANTHEM**—is the worship of the congregation sung through the voice of the Choir. The Choir offers praise to God on our behalf.
- 13. **THE SERMON**—is the proclamation of the Word of God as set forth in Scripture. Drawn from one or both of the Scripture readings, and using these texts as foundation, the sermon seeks to make the message of these texts come alive in the faith and life of the hearers. The sermon provides a bridge between the ancient, abiding truths of Scripture and our contemporary experience. The faithful proclamation of the Word has been a central concern and strength of Presbyterian and Reformed Worship.

Let's begin to approach our morning of worship as we enter the Sanctuary—directing our hearts and minds towards our gracious God in order to glorify Him and give ourselves totally to Him in praise and worship.
