The Season of Rummage Sales: a Time for Decluttering

Burke's annual rummage sale will soon be here – July 22 and 23. Have you started sifting through items to donate? Are you willing to declutter?

A few years back, I attended **Change or Die Conference** where I heard Rev. Jodi Houge of Humble Walk, a ministry of the ELCA in St. Paul, Minnesota. Their mission is to be the body of Christ in their community. They are not seeking to be a new church with a building but rather to walk with Jesus *into* their community. Rev. Houge described this time in the church now as being in a season of decluttering.

Martin Luther in the Reformation 500 years ago came to the realization that there are some things in the church that had to go. The theology of glory that held people captive had to go. It was time to declutter.

One of the lasting impacts of the Reformation was the notion that the church is to be always reforming. Over time we've seen that some things have to go while others are foundational, like the theology of the cross and the five solas: By Scripture alone. By faith alone. By Grace alone. By Christ alone. For the glory of God alone. These must stay. But there is room to declutter so that these might truly shine.

Rev. Houge mentioned a few things that should be decluttered to allow room for new life to flourish. The task of the church right now is "to sift through stuff and see what is dead and let it go, but keep the good," she said. She started the list with "whiteness has got to go, and staying in our buildings has got to go." What would you get rid of and what would you keep in the Big-C Church rummage sale? What do you think needs decluttering ... so that we can best be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world?

Prayer: Come, Holy Spirit, come. Fill us with your love and wisdom. Open us up and use us in this time of transition to be all that you intend for us to be in the world. Amen.

Four Layer Rhubarb Dessert

First layer—-1 1/2 cup flour 3/4 cup softened butter 1/2 cup chopped nuts Combine ingredients (I use a pastry blender) and pat lightly into a 9x13 pan. Bake 15 - 20 minutes at 350 in a metal pan, or 325 in a glass pan. Let cool

Second layer 1 (8 oz) pkg. cream cheese, softened. 1 cup powdered sugar 1 cup Cool Whip Beat cream cheese and powdered sugar together, and blend in 1 cup of Cool Whip. Spread over the cooled crust, and let chill.

Third layer 6 cups rhubarb, cut up (fresh or frozen) 1 1/2 cup sugar 2 tablespoons minute tapioca Dash of nutmeg - optional Being all ingredients to a boil, and cook 5 minutes, or until tender. Cool well, and spread over the second layer.

Fifth layer Spread the remaining Cool Whip over, using most of a 12 oz. container. Chopped nuts, if desired.
