ENTRY AGREEMENT

All classes will be judged according to the specifications outlined in the HHSA prize list class descriptions and in accordance with United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA) Rules.

Competitors, trainers, horses, and horse owners must be current members of the HHSA in order to qualify for show championship and year-end awards, with the exception of those riders entered in the Short Stirrup/Long Stirrup Division. Riders wishing to accrue USHJA Outreach points must be members of USHJA for their points to accrue.

I have read the HHSA and USHJA rules and the specifications as printed in the Prize List for this Competition and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to the current HHSA Rulebook and the stated rules of the competition. By entering this competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longueur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the HHSA, USHJA, and the rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the USHJA, HHSA, and of this competition. I will accept as final any decision of the Judge, the Show Steward, an adjudicator, an HHSA Board Representative, and/or Hearing Committee on any question arising under any of these Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the HHSA, the USHJA their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

HHSA is a USHJA Affiliate Organization. The 2017 Fall Classic Horse Show is a USHJA Outreach Competition Offering USHJA Outreach Classes, which qualifies riders, who are members of USHJA, for Outreach year-end awards for Zone 11 (Hawaii). These points are accrued by the rider.

The USHJA Outreach Program is open to both Juniors (17 and under) and Adult Amateurs who possess current USEF/USHJA Amateur certification.

Riders need not be members of USHJA (United States Hunter Jumper Association) to compete in this horse show, but if they are, their points in Outreach classes will accrue, and they will qualify for Zone 11 year-end awards. Outreach USHJA membership is discounted for HHSA members at \$35 annually. USHJA members will receive *In Stride* Magazine plus all the rights and privileges of USHJA membership for that year. USEF and USHJA hold and provide no regulatory function regarding the competition or association. Because these competitions are not sanctioned or licensed, neither USEF nor USHJA will hear grievances or become involved in the regulatory process of the competition, association or their participants. Compliance with USHJA Outreach Competition requirements is the responsibility of the individual competition management at each event.

General Rules and Information

No other persons besides show management or their representative may approach the Judge during the show. Questions or concerns should be directed to the Show Steward. Approaching the Judge prior to the completion of the last class may result in disqualification from the show and/or a possible fine to be determined by the HHSA Awards Committee.

Dogs: Unleashed dogs are not permitted on the show grounds.

Eligibility: Ribbons won in Hunter Seat Classes (not to jump) shall not affect a rider's status in classes over fences. Eligibility to enter Short Stirrups/Long Stirrups classes should be checked with the HHSA Records Keeper and/or show secretary.

Entry Fees: Entry fees for all classes are listed on the show entry form. There will be a \$20 fee for all returned checks.

Post Entries: Must be made prior to the first call of the previous class. Exhibitors submitting an entry blank after the closing date may post-enter at the regular fee plus \$10 per class. In classes requiring individual work, post entries may be placed first in the starting order. Note: A separate entry blank is required for each horse-rider combination. Entries not received by October 1 will be subject to the \$10 post entry fee per class.

Hat Rule: It is compulsory for all persons at HHSA hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear, which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with the harness secured. It is required when riding on the flat and jumping anywhere on the competition grounds. The Judge must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

HHSA Membership: Competitors, trainers, horses, and horse owners must be current members of the HHSA in order to qualify for show championships and year-end awards. Current membership numbers must be included on entry blanks. Parents or guardians signing as trainer or coach do not have to be current members. Exception: Competitors and horses in the Short Stirrup/Long Stirrup Division are not required to be members of HHSA.

USHJA Membership: This is a USHJA Outreach competition offering both Hunter and Medal classes for Juniors and Adult Amateurs. For Zone award points in these classes to be accrued, the rider must be a member of USHJA. These points are accrued by the rider.

Volunteer Requirement for year-end Awards: HHSA is an all-volunteer organization. We need parents and riders to actively help us organize and run these horse shows. In addition, to qualify for 2017 year-end awards, each HHSA competing member must contribute at least six (6) hours of volunteer work at HHSA-sanctioned events during the 2017 show season. A rider under 14 years of age may have a parent or other sponsor volunteer for a minimum of six (6) hours on his or her behalf. For a horse to be eligible for year-end awards, the rider or owner must volunteer at least six (6) hours. Kickers: Horses that kick must be marked with a red ribbon on the tail.

Numbers: There is a \$5 fee for numbers not returned by the end of the show.

Prize Money: Checks will be mailed/postmarked within 14 days after the close of the show. Checks will be payable to the owner listed on the entry blank.

Show Hours: NOTE: The secretary's booth will open the day before the show, Friday October 13 at 4:30 pm for one (1) hour. The first warm-up class will begin promptly at 8:00 am each day. In the case of public address system malfunction, it is the rider's responsibility to be on time for each class.

Refunds: After the close of entries, refunds (less \$10 for handling expenses) will be mailed only upon written certification of unsoundness by a veterinarian (or judge during the show), or in the case of personal illness, by a physician. Certifications must be received within three (3) days after the close of the show. No exhibitor may

withdraw his/her horse from the show without permission from the Show Secretary. If he/she does so, he/she may be disqualified for the remainder of the show and his/her fees forfeited.

Tack: Correct tack must be used in all events. Regulations are stated in both the HHSA and USHJA rule books. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with and comply with HHSA and USHJA rules.

Ties: In the case of ties for Championships, winner will be the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. Should a tie still exist, dual Championships will be awarded and no reserve championship will be given. If a tie exists for reserve championship the winner will be the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences, should a tie still exist, dual reserve championships will be awarded.

Warm-Up Classes WU-1, WU-2, WU-3, WU-4, WU-5: Non-judged warm-up rounds will be available for a \$15 fee per round in the main arena. These warm ups are open to all horses and riders provided they have a completed entry form and signed waiver for the competition. Horses or riders do not have to be entered in any specific height division to enter to ride in any warm up. Any horse or rider entered in the horse show may ride in any warm up. There will be five (5) specific warm-up sessions based on fence height. Fences will be available at the minimum height in each warm-up. The designated warm-up round that all warm-up competitors will ride, will be the posted Course A. Riders and horses may enter the warm-up multiple times with the same rider or different riders. NOTE: There is a limit of five (5) rounds per horse per warm-up division. See class list for schedule of warm-up classes. An announcement will be made when the show arena is open for schooling.

For Short Stirrups /Long Stirrups Classes: There will be no individual warm-up rounds for Short Stirrups/Long Stirrups. Instead, after the course is set for the 18" cross rail class, the arena will be open for at least a 20-minute period where riders entered in the horse show and Short Stirrups/Long Stirrups Competitors may school with their trainers and warm up over the course or on the flat. There will be no charge for this warm up opportunity.

Schooling Fences: Fences will be set up in the warm-up arena. Specific schooling regulations will be posted at the secretary's booth and must be observed by exhibitors. NOTE: Exhibitors must wear hard hats while schooling or riding on the grounds.

Jumping Order: This will be assigned according to the receipt of entries by the Show Secretary. Entries received last will be placed first in the jumping order, starting with post-entries. If entries warrant classes jumping the same height will be run together. Prizes will be awarded separately according to the class entered.

Stabling: A limited number of stalls are available and must be paid for in advance. Please refer to the stabling application form in this prize list for details.

Location of show: Koko Crater Stables is located at 7491 Kokonani Street, Honolulu, Hawaii
(Please note this location does not receive mail and is not the business address of Koko Crater Stables)

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license, which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles, provided they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions by HHSA against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Awards

ATTENTION: To qualify for HHSA show championships and year-end awards, rider, horse, and owner must be current members of HHSA (except for Short/Long Stirrups). Proof of membership may be required. It is suggested that you attach a copy of all current HHSA membership email verifications or cards for rider, horse, and owner, with your show entry forms. If you are riding a horse that you do not own, then that owner must be a current HHSA member for the points to count for show and year end championships.

NOTE: Adult Amateurs will need to attach a copy of their USEF/USHJA Amateur Certification to participate in Adult Amateur classes and to qualify for show and year end championships and USHJA Outreach point accrual.

NOTE: Outreach competitors who wish their points to be accrued for Outreach Classes must also be members of USHJA. Competitors may fill out application at registration and pay the USHJA Outreach show fee and yearly membership at the competition for their points to count for that show.

Class Descriptions

Performance Hunter Division

Two HHS A Performance Divisions will be offered: Performance Hunter 2'6" Classes 8, 9, 15 and Performance Hunter 2'9" Classes 21, 22, 29

HHS A Performance classes are **open** classes and are therefore open to all riders (Non-Professionals, Professionals, Adult, Adult Amateurs, and Children/Juniors). All Hunters will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Fences shall simulate obstacles found in the hunting field, such as brush, stonewall, white board gate, rail, or fence, natural rail, chicken coop, or other natural obstacles. The Performance Hunter Division is available at two heights: 2'6" and 2'9". A Performance Hunter is a horse of any age, and is not restricted by previous showing in any other division. No more than 50 percent of fences may be at the maximum height. Need not be jogged for soundness. Cross entry between open performance divisions is permissible. HHS A points in these classes are accrued by the horse.

Class 8 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'6" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6". Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. No in and outs are permitted.

Class 9 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'6" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6". Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. No in and outs are permitted.

Class 15 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'6" Under Saddle: To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'6" Performance Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 21 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'9" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'9". Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 22 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'9" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'9". Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 29 HHS A Performance Hunter 2'9" Under Saddle: To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'9" Performance Hunter, Course A or B.

Adult Amateur Hunter Division

There are five HHS A divisions offered: **Introductory (2'0") Class 1, 2, 3; Low (2'3") Class 4, 5, 7; Medium (2'6") Class 12, 13, 17; High (3'0") Class 24, 25, 30; Modified (3'3") Class 27, 28, 31.**

All Adult Amateurs must have current USEF/USHJA Amateur Certification to enter these classes. These divisions are run concurrently with the corresponding Children/Junior divisions, but will be pinned separately if entries warrant. There is **NO cross entry of riders between any of these divisions at the same show.**

To be ridden by adults who meet USHJA eligibility requirements for Amateur status, and have current USHJA/USEF amateur certification. To be judged on performance and soundness over a minimum of 8 fences. Fence heights not to exceed the stated height, spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. No more than 50 percent of the fences may be at the maximum height. Ponies may be ridden by an adult, suitability to count. Entries need not be jogged for soundness.

Classes 1, 2, 3 (HHS A Introductory) and Classes 12,13,17 (HHS A Medium) are also USHJA Outreach Hunter classes. These two divisions will be held concurrently with HHS A Medium 2'6" and HHS A Introductory 2'0" Hunter divisions. These divisions are open to both Children and Adult Amateurs who are members of USHJA. Points earned in these classes will accrue for USHJA Zone 11 year-end awards. USHJA Outreach points follow the rider. There is no cross entry between these divisions.

Class 1 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Introductory Adult Amateur Hunter 2'0" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'0" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence height exceeds 2'3".

Class 2 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Introductory Adult Amateur Hunter 2'0" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'0" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence height exceeds 2'3".

Class 3 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Introductory Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle 2'0": Not to Jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses will **not** be required to hand gallop. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in USHJA Outreach/ HHSA Introductory 2'0" Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 4 HHSA Low Adult Amateur Hunter 2'3" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence heights exceed 2'6".

Class 5 HHSA Low Adult Amateur Hunter 2'3" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence heights exceed 2'6".

Class 7 HHSA Low Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle 2'3": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses *may* be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'3" Low Adult Amateur Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 12 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Medium Adult Amateur Hunter 2'6" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. No in and outs are permitted at this height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence height exceeds 2'9".

Class 13 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Medium Adult Amateur Hunter 2'6" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. No in and outs are permitted at this height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. Riders may not enter any class in the show where the fence height exceeds 2'9".

Class 17 USHJA Outreach / HHSA Medium Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle 2'6": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'6" Medium Adult Amateur Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 24 HHSA High Adult Amateur Hunter 3'0" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 25 HHSA High Adult Amateur Hunter 3'0" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 30 HHSA High Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle 3'0": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 3'0" High Amateur Adult Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 26 HHSA Modified Adult Amateur Hunter 3'3" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 27 HHSA Modified Adult Amateur Hunter 3'3" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 31 HHSA Modified Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle 3'3": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses will be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Modified Amateur Adult Hunter 3'3", Course A or B.

Children's Hunter Division

Four HHSA Children's Hunter Divisions will be offered: Introductory (2'0") Class 1, 2, 3; Low (2'3") Class 4, 5, 7; Medium (2'6") Class 10, 11, 16; High (3'0") Class 24, 25, 30

These divisions are run concurrently with the corresponding Adult Amateur divisions but will be pinned separately if entries warrant. There is **no cross entry of riders between any of these divisions at the same show**. Open to horses and ponies to be ridden by a Junior Exhibitor (17 years old and under). To be judged on performance and soundness over a minimum of 8 fences. In all classes, manners will be emphasized and extreme speed will be penalized. No more than 50 percent of fences may be at the maximum height and any spreads may not exceed the height of the fence. Entries need not be jogged for soundness.

USHJA Outreach Hunter classes will be held concurrently with HHSA Medium 2'6" and HHSA Introductory 2'0" Hunter Classes. These class are open to both Children and Adult Amateurs who are members of USHJA and have current Amateur Certification. Points earned in these classes will follow the rider and accrue for USHJA Zone 11 year-end awards.

Class 1 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Introductory Children's Hunter 2'0" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'0" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height.

Class 2 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Introductory Children's Hunter 2'0" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'0" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height.

Class 3 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Introductory Children's Hunter Under Saddle 2'0": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses will not be required to hand gallop. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'0" Introductory Children's Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 4 HHSA Low Children's Hunter 2'3" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height.

Class 5 HHSA Low Children's Hunter 2'3" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. No oxers or in and outs are permitted at this height.

Class 7 HHSA Low Children's Hunter Under Saddle 2'3": Not to Jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Low Children's Hunter 2'3", Course A or B.

Class 10 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Medium Children's Hunter 2'6" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. No in and outs are permitted at this height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 11 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Medium Children's Hunter 2'6" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. No in and outs are permitted at this height. Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence.

Class 16 USHJA Outreach/HHSA Medium Children's Hunter Under Saddle 2'6": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 2'6" Medium Children's Hunter, Course A or B.

Class 24 HHSA High Children's Hunter 3'0" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of fence.

Class 25 HHSA High Children's Hunter 3'0" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of fence.

Class 30 HHSA High Children's Hunter Under Saddle 3'0": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the Judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in 3'0" High Children's Hunter, Course A or B.

Junior Hunter Division

Open to horses and ponies to be ridden by a Junior Exhibitor (17 years old and under). To be judged on performance and soundness (but need not be jogged in). In all classes, manners will be emphasized and extreme speed will be penalized. No more than 50 percent of fences may be at the maximum height. Spreads must not exceed the height of fence. **Cross entry** between Junior, Introductory, Low, Medium or High Children's Hunter by a rider at the same show is **NOT** permitted. NOTE: Junior Hunter and Modified Adult Amateur Hunter will be run concurrently but pinned separately if entries warrant.

Class 26 HHSA Junior Hunter 3'3" – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of fence.

Class 27 HHSA Junior Hunter 3'3" – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. Spreads not to exceed the height of fence.

Class 31 HHSA Junior Hunter Under Saddle 3'3": Not to jump. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses will be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Junior Hunter 3'3", Course A or B.

Equitation Division

Medal Classes: HHSA Medal classes are offered at four heights: **Class 6 Low 2'3"**; **Class 14 Medium 2'6"**; **Class 23 High 2'9"- 3'0"**; **Class 28 Junior/Modified Adult Amateur 3'3"** NOTE: **There is no cross entry between medal classes at the same competition.**

All HHSA Medal Classes are open to Junior's (17 years old and under) and Adult Amateurs with current USHJA Amateur Certification. Medal classes test a rider's ability to navigate a course consisting of a minimum of 6 obstacles and one or two changes of direction. Additional USHJA tests may be required and may be incorporated into the over fences round. Competitors who are HHSA members can accrue points toward HHSA Medal year-end Awards in Low 2'3", Medium 2'6", High 2'9"- 3'0" and Junior 3'3" classes. NOTE: Medal classes are **ONLY** open to Adult Amateurs and Juniors (17 years old and under). Adult Amateurs must process current USEF Amateur certification.

Class 6 HHSA Low Medal Class 2'3": Open to Children and Adult Amateurs with current USHJA/USEF Amateur certification. Riders may not cross-enter into any class exceeding 2'6" at the same competition. No combinations or oxers are allowed at this height. Open to Juniors (17 years old and under) and Adult Amateurs. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. This class will be held concurrently with the Amy Rich Memorial Trophy 2'3".

Class 6 Amy Rich Memorial Trophy 2'3": Only riders who are 13 years old and under AND who are also members of HHSA will accrue points toward the end-of-year Amy Rich Award in the HHSA Low Medal Class 2'3". This year-end memorial was established to give incentive to the very young and to honor the woman who devoted her life to the encouragement and instruction of young people in the care and riding of horses. The Amy Rich Award is only open to riders 13 years old and under. Riders lose eligibility for consideration if they compete over a course in any competition where the height exceeds 2'6". This class will be held concurrently with the HHSA Low Medal Class 2'3". Riders (13 years old and under) who are members of HHSA may also accrue

year-end HHS A Low Medal points in this class. Juniors not qualified for Amy Rich may accrue year-end HHS A Low Medal points in this class. Adult Amateurs may accrue year-end HHS A Low Medal points in this class.

Class 14 USHJA Outreach Medal 2'6": Open to Children and Adult Amateurs who have current USHJA/USEF Amateur Certification. This Medal class tests a rider's ability to navigate a course consisting of a minimum of 6 obstacles and one or two changes of direction. Additional USHJA tests may be required and may be incorporated into the over fences round. Riders may not cross-enter into any class exceeding 3'0" at the same competition. No in and out combinations are allowed at this height. Spreads cannot exceed the fence height. Riders may not have competed in a national medal class at 3'0" or higher during that competition year. Open to both Juniors 17 years old and under and Adult Amateurs with current USEF/USHJA Amateur certification AND who are members of USHJA. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. Juniors and Adult Amateurs may accrue HHS A Medium Medal 2'6" points in this class and if they are members of USHJA may accrue USHJA Outreach Medal 2'6" year-end points as well.

Class 14 HHS A Medium Medal Class 2'6": Held concurrently with the USHJA Outreach Medal Class 2'6". Riders may not cross-enter any class exceeding 3'0" at the same competition. No in-and-out combinations are allowed at this height. Spreads cannot exceed the fence height. This class is open to both Juniors (17 years old and under) and Adult Amateurs with current USEF/USHJA Amateur Certification. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. Juniors and Adult Amateurs who are members of HHS A may accrue year-end HHS A Medium Medal 2'6" points in this class.

Class 23 HHS A High Medal Class (2'9"- 3'0"): Riders may not cross-enter into any class 3'3" or higher at the same competition. Combinations and further testing are encouraged but not required. Open to both Juniors (17 years old and under) and Adult Amateurs with current USHJA Amateur certification. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. Juniors and Adult Amateurs who are members of HHS A may accrue year-end HHS A High Medal points 2'9"-3'0" in this class.

Class 28 Junior / Adult Amateur Modified HHS A Medal Class 3'3": This Medal class tests a rider's ability to navigate a course consisting of a minimum of 6 obstacles and one or two changes of direction. Additional USHJA tests may be required and may be incorporated into the over fences round. Riders may not cross-enter into any other medal class at the same competition. Combinations and further testing are encouraged but not required. Open to both Juniors (17 and under) and Adult Amateurs with current USHJA Amateur certification. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. Juniors who are members of HHS A may accrue year-end HHS A Junior Medal 3'3" points in this class. Adult Amateurs who are members of HHS A may accrue year-end HHS A Modified Medal Class 3'3" points in this class.

NOTE: There is no cross entry between medal classes at the same show, however riders may change from one section to another in subsequent shows.

Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump

Class 18 HHS A Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump (13 years old and under): To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion.

Class 32 HHS A Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump (14 to 17 years old): To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion.

Class 19 HHS A Adult Amateur Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump: Open to Adult Amateurs with current USEF/USHJA certification. To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion. **Note: No Cross-entry between Equitation age divisions is permitted. Age is of January 1 of that show year.**

Short Stirrups / Long Stirrups Division

Open to riders of all ages. **These classes are designed for the less experienced rider** who wishes to gain show experience and who has shown for no more than two (2) show seasons (partial seasons to count). Riders in this division may not cross enter into any other division or class in the horse show.

Warm-up for Short Stirrups / Long Stirrups: As soon as the course is set for the 18" cross rail class, there will be open schooling for Short and Long Stirrup Competitors. Trainers may be present in the ring. There will be no charge for this warm up. Horses may be schooled by another competitor entered in the show. There will be no schooling by individuals not entered in the horse show. If a rider not entered in the show wishes to school they must fill out an entry form, sign all release forms and pay any fees.

Class 35 HHSA Short Stirrups / Long Stirrups Hunter Seat Equitation Over Cross Rails: To be judged over a maximum of 5 cross rails not to exceed 18". Cross rails may be taken at the trot or canter. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless they are the fault of the rider.

Class 36 HHSA Short Stirrups / Long Stirrups Hunter Seat Equitation (walk, trot) not to jump, not to canter: To be judged at a walk and trot both ways of the ring.

Class 37 HHSA Short Stirrups / Long Stirrups Hunter Seat Equitation (walk, trot, canter) not to jump: To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Competitors will canter Individually.

Special Classes

Class 20 HHSA Open English Pleasure Horse \$200 Stake: Open to horses and ponies. To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. The English Pleasure Horse may be a stallion, mare, or gelding of any type or breed. It is imperative that the horse gives the distinct appearance of being a pleasure to ride and display a pleasurable attitude. To this end, all gaits must be performed with willingness and obvious ease, cadence, balance and smoothness. There is an emphasis on manners and ability to afford a pleasurable ride. At least three riders must compete for the class to be held.

Class 33 USHJA Outreach Derby 2'6" - 2'9" \$200 Stake: USHJA Outreach Hunter Derby is held over a single-round course of no more than 10 fences at 2'6" in height, with two option fences set at 2'9". The course will consist of Hunter Classic and Hunter Handy style lines, turns and jumps. The Judge will use the open numerical scoring system. After the Judge's score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped successfully (no knockdowns or refusals) for a maximum of two additional points added to the Judge's score. This class is limited to Juniors (17 years old and under) and Adult Amateurs with current USHJA/USEF Certification. At least three riders must compete for the class to be held.

Class 34 HHSA High Derby 2'9" – 3'0" \$200 Stake: This is a two-round format utilizing the open numerical system to score competitors in the Classic Hunter Round (first round) on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. In addition, the base score in the Handy Hunter round (second round) reflects brilliance of pace and handiness. In each round, after the Judge's base score is given, one point will be added or each high-option fence jumped up to a maximum of two. The point must be added even if there is a refusal, rail down, or a loss of good jumping style at that fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height fence option. No more than 10 fences in the round and obstacles are reminiscent of the hunt field and must offer a variety of appearances, such as natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs and natural foliage. The Handy Hunter round should simulate riding over hunt country and incorporate options such as tight turns, clever options for jump approaches, hand galloping and trotting a fence. Fences for the HHSA Derby are set at 2'9" with two high-option fences set at 3'0". Horse-and-rider combinations scoring 60 percent or higher (or at the Judge's discretion) after the first round are eligible to return for the second round. The pair with the highest two-round score is declared the class winner. Ribbons are awarded to eight places. At least three riders must compete for the class to be held.
