

WHY PARTNER?

Partnering with likeminded ministries is the best use of time and resources. It also allows us to pool our creativity, talents, and connections.

Romans 12:4-5 says, "For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. "

Partnering also unifies the body of Christ, which pleases our Father and brings glory to Him.

OPTIONS

A. Do Nothing

It may not be feasible at this time to pursue an expanded ministry in Washington Park because of the present climate of our fellowship, financial barriers, and the high-risk community. This option would have us re-visit this project in one year.

B. Sell Property & Reallocate Assets

We have looked into the values of property on Bunkum Road. Within one mile west of the 5215 property, there are several properties for sale. Each one of these properties (3990, 3950, 4044, 4002) are one-third of an acre to two and a half acres. The realtor has them listed for \$570,000.00 dollars each. They have been on the market for approximately 60 months.

This option assumes that it would be in our best interest to sell the property and reallocate the funds for church planting elsewhere in the state of Illinois. It may be determined to give the money back to the Washington Park community or a church of similar belief.

C. SUPPORT MINISTRY FINANCIALLY

Columbus Road has allocated a large amount of money into the Pittsfield replant. This financial commitment has been over time and will remain in the foreseeable future. It is estimated that the replant and renovation costs of the Pittsfield property are somewhere around \$300,000. The amount includes gifts from other churches in our region as well as Baptist Builders Club.

To adequately fund Bible Baptist's ministry in Washington Park, this option would require a minimum of \$20,000 dollars per year in the first three years to retain a presence in the community. This money would come from strategic partners over time.

D. DISSOLVE PRESENT CHURCH STRUCTURE & REORGANIZE

1. Disband Current Church Structure

This option provides an opportunity to reset the ministry's history as well as present inactivity. It would be valuable to re-think strategy and ministry in Washington Park. Things to consider would be the target audience, structure, style, ethnicity and scope of ministry.

2. Re-birth New Church

At the completion of reorganization, a new church would be birthed. A new identity, name and ministry structure would be put into place.

E. RE-BIRTH CHURCH FROM OUTREACH CENTER MODEL

1. Begin with Outreach

This option would begin an active outreach into the community. It would include involvement with community leaders, identifying needs and planning initiatives to engage the people.

2. Re-birth Church from Outreach Center

It will be important to maintain the objective of starting a church. This could be done with multiple use of the facility with weekend services as a part of the community outreach.

Outreach Center — Church

Because of Bible Baptist's total disconnection from the community, it is imperative that this ministry create a relationship with the residents of Washington Park, Illinois. With current restrictions on resources, including people, a practical and pragmatic solution to this need is to create an outreach center. An outreach center would reconnect Bible Baptist into the community and provide a long-term impact for the gospel.
