

KNOW YOUR FAITH

St. ..., Pray for us! The Intercession of the saints



The saints are believed to be perpetually in the presence of God, beholding Him face-to-face (cf. 1 John 3:1-3). With this belief, we always pray through them to God, invoking their intercession. Many have argued, and as the Bible mentions, that Jesus is the only way to the Father (cf. John 14:6), why then do we need to pray through the saints? Truly Jesus is the only way to the Father, but that is in His capacity as our Redeemer. At the fullness of time, He stood between us and God, reconciling us to the Fa-

ther by taking upon Himself the condemnation due us. He is not our mediator by way of supplication (Beccari, "Beatification and Canonization," 1907), for we do not pray THROUGH his name, but IN his name (cf. John 14:13-14). Remember, He is God. He is not appealing to God for us again and again. He has done that once and for all (Hebrew 9:25-26, 10:1-18).

The saints, on the other hand, knows what it means to struggle as human beings, with the powers of sin and death. They knew what it took to overcome these powers – the grace of God - and they use the grace to the glory of God and for the salvation of their soul. All through their lives, they lived in supplication to God, for they were yet to attain full perfection in God, which is the salvation of their souls. It is thus fitting that we pray in supplication to God through the saints, who were once one with us in their struggles with the power of sin and death, and knew the power of supplication to God. St. Paul, in his letters to the churches in Rome, Corinth, Colossae, and Ephesus besought his brethren for their prayers on his behalf to God (cf. Romans 15:30, 2 Corinthians 1:11, Colossians 4:3, and Ephesians 6:18-19) (Beccari, "Beatification and Canonization," 1907). If, like Paul, we can request the prayers of those who are still on earth, how much more rewarding it is to ask for the intercession of those in heaven. Through his prayer request to his brothers and sisters, Paul showed them the significance of their unity as a family on their pilgrim journey to the Father. The saints, though gone before us marked with the sign of faith, are still prayerfully in union with us who are still on earth, and on our pilgrim journey to God. As such, to pray through the saints to God is to testify to that union we share with the saints. Most importantly, requesting the intercession of the saints is to acknowledge the grace of God at work in their lives while on earth and now in heaven.

Baptism: Parents desiring baptism for their children are encouraged to contact the pastor at least two weeks in advance to arrange for the required preparation class for parents and godparents.


Sacrament of Matrimony: Any parishioner seeking marriage must contact the Pastor at least six (6) months prior to the desired wedding date.
