
# January Meeting Project

### Heart Warmer!

First let me say that I have no idea who designed this pattern nor who painted my original. I believe I bought it at a craft show, possibly the Senior Citizen's Show, easily 6 or more years ago. It's my opinion that it could be a Cindy Mann Vitale design but I haven't found this same piece on the net anywhere. My sincerest apologies to both the designer and the painter because I would love to give you credit for this piece. I just love it.

As is Chapter tradition, our January project is a friendly little snowman, happily bundled up to stay warm. This is a simple little project painted on canvas to wrap around your favorite jar candle. We will be painting pale washes of acrylic on Roc-Lon canvas with a little bit of shading and a lot of ink work. You are welcome to do this on any surface you choose but I will bring pre-prepped Roc-Lon strips for those who want them. I've



cut them a little longer than the original so they should fit most any big jar candle. The cost will be \$5 which will include the canvas, prepped with gesso and white acrylic, printed instructions and use of my glitter paint for the snowflakes and any other paint, too, if necessary. The pattern is included in this newsletter. I'll have extra instructions for those who bring their own surfaces.

Supplies include your regular acrylic painting supplies plus:

Micron pens, especially very fine but an assortment of sizes would be nice

A hard surface to hold your canvas (optional, a clipboard works really well; just to keep your hands out of the paint.)

Mop brush (optional)

Floating medium for acrylics if you like to use it for large areas of floated color (optional)

When finished, pinking shears or decorative scissors to trim the edges

Paints: Remember, close counts when it comes to colors. Bring what you already have.

White Light Buttermilk burgundy


red orange

A soft, golden yellow (eg. Golden Straw or Marigold)

Light brown (eg. Espresso, Mississippi Mud, Milk Chocolate)

Hauser green medium, Avocado or other medium value green of your choice.

If you'd like to do the scarf and hat in a color other than green, feel free to bring a medium value of that color. You can make it work! This one is easy. Grab your regular supplies and COME PAINT! No prep, just fun! See you there.


# **Oklahoma City Painting Palooza**
