**To Kentucky and Back**

I recently got back from a mission trip to Vanceburg, Kentucky. I left with a group from St. Agnes church in Freeland on July 9, and we got back in Michigan on July 15. I wanted to write a little reflection on the trip, and share some insights with this lovely parish.

First off, my perception of poverty, and of Kentucky overall changed because of this trip. I realized that many different forms of poverty exist. People can be poor spiritually, materially, emotionally, and in other ways still. In my mind I restricted poverty to only mean materially poor. While there are people in Kentucky who do not have a high income or a decent house, these people are spiritually rich. They exude joy, care, and generosity even with the little they own. Our groups visited several nursing homes and assisted living centers in Vanceburg and the neighboring town of Garrison. Those residents appreciated our visits not because we brought cash but because through our visits we answered their cry of loneliness. All people need to understand they are known, loved, and cared for; or in other words their life has meaning. There are people around this area who have this same cry.

Secondly, God showed me his providential love time and time again. We know that God speaks to us in many ways. He speaks to us through the Scriptures, Church teaching, private and public prayer, and through others. The people we met were so kind, compassionate, and loving, and I knew God was showing his love for me through them. They also gave me hope that joy can overcome bitterness, and struggling in life does not have to result in despair. The power of the Gospel and a relationship with Jesus Christ, the Father, and the Holy Spirit can shine light even in the darkest places.

I would highly encourage people to go on a mission trip. I gained a lot from this trip, and I suspect you also would too. We do not need to go to another state or another country to serve because there are people in our own backyard who need to meet Jesus. Is there a family member who is lonely? Can you meet some new people and help feed the poor? Can you spend fifteen minutes a day in quiet or mental prayer? We are all on a mission trip, and that is the mission of revealing Jesus in the world. How can you serve in the greatest mission in the history of mankind? -Marc Hopps
