Sojourner Truth

Sunday, November 15 at 1:00pm Ames Mansion



Sojourner Truth was born into slavery in Hurley, New York, as Isabella Baumfree. During 29 years as a slave she developed a close relationship with God which enabled her, in 1843, to walk away from slavery. She eventually took the name Sojourner Truth. Joining other abolitionists such as Frederick Douglass and Harriet Tubman, Sojourner took the road to free her people. She became a powerful speaker again slavery and for the rights for women. As the end of the Civil War drew near, she was appointed counselor for the Freedman's Relief Association. The last years of her life were spent petitioning the U.S. government to turn over western lands to former slaves. Kathryn Woods will portray Sojourner Truth in this powerful presentation. Presentation will last approximately 45 minutes, followed by a O & A.

Tickets at \$10 per person and Members of the Friends of Borderland are \$8. Children 10 and younger are free. Seating is limited, first-come, first-seated.
