Follow the Leader

Did you ever play "follow the leader" when you were young? I did, in fact I have very vivid memories of forming a line single file behind someone in our group who volunteered to be the leader and trying my best to do everything, and go everywhere the others did. (We never lacked for volunteers, everyone wanted to be the leader because he got to choose what we did). Do you know we really didn't play follow the leader at all. We played "follow the one in front of you" or "follow the one you're watching." There's a difference you know. The leader invariably chose to do things that he knew most of the rest would have difficulty in doing. So, the second in line did his best to imitate the leader-the third in line tried to do the same thing the second did. The fourth one followed the third, the fifth the fourth and so on down the line till those that were at the end of the line were never aware of the actions of the leader, but were just doing what they saw the other fellow

Jesus said, "follow thou me" but very often we that name the name of Christ are playing the game of "follow the ones nearest you" and we're really missing out on the best things in life that Jesus intended for us to enjoy. We're not following Jesus, we're following other Christians. And in frustration we're measuring ourselves by ourselves and comparing ourselves among ourselves and the Bible says this is not wise. Our Leader, our yardstick, our pattern, yes, our all in all, is Jesus. And He's still standing at the head of the line saying, "Follow thou Me-not those other fellows-not the best Christian you know-not the preacher, however superior he is-not any human beingbut Me. I am the Leader. Oh, the blessings He could bestow on all of us and the sorrows and pitfalls we could avoid if we could learn to follow Jesus and not those around us. We'll never go wrong following Him. He never asks us to do anything that He knows we can't do but he's patient and longsuffering, He remembers we are dust and He knows our frame. And when He sees our strength is gone He reaches down, picks us up and lovingly soothes our aches, calms our fears and reassures us that He understands and cares.

It seems that we have a great capacity for worrying about what God is doing for and with the other fellow in comparison with our lot. Peter had it. After Jesus had asked him the three times "Lovest thou Me" and told him to feed his lambs and sheep, Peter looked at John, the beloved and asked, "Lord, and what shall this man do?" And Jesus answered, "IF I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? Follow thou Me." Has the Lord ever jolted you back to reality abruptly with similar words? He has me. He's really saying, that's none of your businessthat's between others and me. All I ask of you is to Follow Me. It's really so simple, just keep your eyes on Jesus and follow Him. He always goes the way before us and he's been tempted in all points like as we and yet without sin. He'll never leave us nor forsake us. And this road from earth to heaven is very narrow you know-there's only room for two-Jesus and Me. If others have complicated things or gotten between us and Jesus it's because we've let them. It's not in the Lord's game plan for it to be so. He has fixed it so it's just an individual thing between each of us and our Leader, Jesus Christ.

The songwriter puts it like this:

I hear the risen Saviour say, "follow me, follow me, follow me." His voice is calling all the day, "follow me, follow me, follow me. For thee I trod the bitter way, for thee I gave my life away, and drank the gall thy debt to pay, follow me, follow me, follow me."



Dear Editor, Naomi Busch:

We have just finished three successful years doing missionary work with the Chinese in the Bay area; what a challenge it was to work with these precious people. We are now back in Arizona ministering to the Yavapai Indians. Seems the Lord always has doors open for us.

Recently we have returned from a trip to Texas and Oklahoma where we visited some of our old friends of the Apostolic Faith Movement. And we wonder if you would want to put some of this account in your Report?

Our first stop was in Amarillo, Texas where we had a lovely visit with Viola (Modrick) Hutson and husband Carl. Of course Viola and my wife, Pauline, had to reminisce of the days they travelled together in the Gospel work. And what a faithful steward Carl has proven to be.

Before continuing this letter we must quote a verse of Scripture from I Corinthians 12:18. "But now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased him." We can not all be Apostles or Prophets or Workers of Miracles, etc. For even we helpers have a place in the body of Christ. The body is not one but many members.

Our next stop was in Canyon, Texas, where we visited our friends the Adairs. Marcus and Mary are doing a wonderful work in this college town. Even Madalene Murray is not able to stop the teaching of God's Word, for college credit, in these lovely facilities just across from the college campus. The erection of this building complex was made possible because of dear Christian friends like yourselves. How important it is for God's people to find their place in the body of Christ and to be obedient to that calling.

And then what a thrill it was to stop by Lubbock and visit with Homer and Pearl Coberly. How deeply indebted I am to them for allowing me to travel with them in the Gospel work at the time when I was just a new born babe in Christ. Not only me but they have helped many other young people to get started on this highway of Holiness. Homer and Pearl have almost run their race and finished their course but I know they have a crown of Righteousness laid up for them in Heaven.

From Lubbock we went to San Antonio where we visited some dear Christian friends, the Ivan Perkins. Midge and Pauline were close friends who grew up in Beaver County Oklahoma. They talked about the time when the Full Gospel Message first came to the panhandle. What precious memories of the Coberlys, the Barker Brothers, the Durhams, the Modricks, Gail Schultz and many other important members of the body of Christ who brought the Love of God to this Community.

Now since Styrle (George) Čook is my cousin and she and Calvin have been pastors in Austin for many years we just had to stop by and say hello to them. Here we found that they had just resigned the church and God has called them to do the work of an Evangelist and also increase their Television Ministry. Certainly we too feel that it will be through the ministry of Television that the Gospel will be preached to every nation before the Lord returns. Praise God for so many good Christian Television programs.

One of the highlights of our trip was to return to Rockdale where in 1932 we assisted the Coberlys in a revival at the Gay Hill Community. We were delighted to stay a couple of days with the Guinn Eilands. They too are some of God's faithful Christians. After a time of prayer and fellowship with Guinn and Lucy, we left to go visit in the home of Millard and Esther Brown, also of Rockdale. What precious memories of the days when Millard and I traveled together in the Gospel work. It was in 1934 that Millard performed the marriage ceremony for Pauline and I in the Full Gospel Church of Perryton, Texas. It had been twenty five years since we had seen the Browns. Millard told us how God was moving in bringing all of God's Children together in Love and Fellowship in these last days. Dear ones we are all parts of the body of Christ and there must not be any schisms in His body when He returns for His own. The tears of joy flowed freely as we took leave of Millard and Esther. Oh how great is the Love of our God!

Another stop was in Sherman, Texas, in the home of R. L. and Sally Coberly. Here we found R. L. teaching piano tuning and repair in the college in that city. How we enjoyed attending church services with them. So many young people coming to church and bringing their Bibles. There was certainly no generation gap in this church. Pauline and I just gave a short testimony of our missionary work, yet the pastor of that church gave us a lovely offering. How God supplies the needs of His Children. Praise Him forever!

It would take too much time and space to tell of the good Pentecostal Conference we attended in Oklahoma City and how the Spirit of God moved in these nightly services.

The next two weeks were spent around Blackwell, Oklahoma, which was my home town. While there we just had to make a trip to Kingman, Kansas, and visit a lovely Christian, Pearl Menke and daughter, Mariolyne. Through all the tests and trials, they have come through victoriously. In reading her book, "Out in the fields with God" one can understand how she can still praise the Lord because she knows the Victor and He has been with her through it all.

Thank God for Christian people everywhere. If you are Born Again then you are my Brother and Sister. It doesn't matter about the name over the door. What does matter is whether your name is written in the Lamb's Book of Life. We can say with Paul "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body."



In Christian service, Howard Whiteley, Superintendent Several months ago the Apostolic Faith Bible College in Baxter Springs, Kansas, incorporated under the name of "Apostolic Faith Church Bible College, Inc."

A prime purpose of this move was to secure recognition of exemption from Federal Income Tax under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

This confirms that you may deduct contributions to the corporation as provided in Section 170 of the Code, also bequest, legacies, devisees, transfers or gifts to or for the use of the corporation are deductible for Federal Estate and gift tax purposes under sections 2055, 2106 and 2522 of the code.

If you should wish to make a contribution to a member church or minister and would like to be protected under this ruling of the IRS, you may send it to the Bible College with instructions and we will run it through our books and send it on to the designated recipient.

The Apostolic Bible College has long recognized that our major source of support was denied us as long as there was a question concerning the IRS recognition of gifts. It is now entirely safe to make the Bible College a beneficiary in your will or trust.



"The Fruit



Of The Holy Spirit"

Galatians 5:22-25—But the **fruit** of the **Spirit** is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance; against such there is no law. And they that are **Christ's** have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the **Spirit**, let us also walk in the **Spirit**.

The fruit of the Holy Spirit is the character and nature of Jesus Christ being shown in the life of the believer. If you want the Spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit manifested in your life (I Corinthians 12: 8-10) you must first have the manifestations of the Fruit of the Holy Spirit. (Galatians 5:22)

The Spirit is both Christ's presence in your life and your response of Faith to divine grace.

The word "Manifestation" means a showing forth, a making visible, or making known. This word shows the Fruit of the Spirit to be the ministry of Jesus shown through His people today. The words fruit, gifts, and manifestation together, give us a fuller picture of the work of the Holy Spirit. We, the members of the body of Christ, should believe that God will show His love through us as needs present themselves day by day.

"The Fruit of the Spirit is Love." Only as we live in love can we fulfill the will of God in our lives. The believer must become love-inspired, love-mastered, and love-driven.

Paul says in II Corinthians 5:14—For the Love of Christ constraineth us: The word constraineth normally means "to hold together," but here (sunecho) means just a little more "urge on, impel, "controls us seems to be justified in this case. Christ's love will keep any believer in His will.

Without the fruit of the Spirit, we are just a religious noise. I Corinthians 13:1—Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity (love), I become

as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal.

"The fruit of the Spirit is love," and it is manifested in joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, and temperance. Joy is love's strength. Peace is love's security. Longsuffering is love's patience. Gentleness is love's conduct. Goodness is love's character. Faith is love's confidence. Meekness is love's humility. Temperance is love's victory. Against such there is no law.

A Holy Spirit-controlled man needs no law to cause him to live a righteous life. The secret of a Spirit-controlled life is found in Romans 12:1-2—I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good and acceptable, and perfect will of God.

To live abundantly in the love of God, you must serve the Lord Jesus Christ, who Himself became our example. He served all the way to Calvary, and there He was the obedient servant, obedient unto death even the death of the cross. Philippians 2:7-8.

The word Fruit, being singular, as usual in Paul's writings, tends to emphasize the unity of the life in the Spirit. It is possible also, that the singular may be intended to point to the person of Christ, in whom all these things are seen in their perfection. The Spirit seeks to produce these by reproducing Christ in the believer. Paul says in Galatians 4:19—My little children, of whom I travail in birth again until Christ be formed in you. Paul is saying his pain and concern were like those of a mother in travail. Yet what he agonizingly sought for was not the new birth of his friends, but the full forming of the new life in them. That new life of the Fruit of the Spirit.

In the light of Paul's preference for the singular form of fruit, it is not necessary to resort to the expedient of putting a dash after Love in order to make all the other items depend on this one. Love is crucial.

Joy is conferred by Christ upon His own followers and is mediated by the Spirit. Peace is the gift of Christ and includes inward repose and harmonious relations with others. Longsuffering related to one's attitude toward others and involves a refusal to retaliate or work vengeance for wrong received. It is literally longspiritedness. Gentleness is better rendered kindness. It is benevolence in action. A distinctly social virtue. Goodness is an uprightness of soul that abhors evil, a clean-cut honesty of motive and conduct. Faith, in this setting, means faithfulness. Meekness is based on humility and denotes an attitude toward others in keeping with due denial of self. Temperance is better rendered self-control (Literally, a holding in with a firm hand), or control of the self life by means of the Spirit. Against such there is no law. Law exists for the purpose of restraint, but in the works of the Spirit there is nothing to restrain.

I would like to look at the fruit of the Spirit again in another light.

The word Fruit, though a collective noun, is singular. The life that has been unified, with Christ at the center, produces a harvest of Fruit, which has many expressions.

Love, Christian love (agape), is not dependent upon the feelings, but upon the reason and the will, Hence it can be commanded as a duty. In the New Testament it expresses

the bond of love between God and man, and that between man and man. We sometimes translated "Charity" and sometimes "Love." The best commentary ever made upon this word is I Corinthians 13.

Joy: This is not the joy that comes from having no trouble. Joy (Chara) is a human expression of divine grace.

Peace: Paul's own life—like that of Jesus—is ample evidence that peace, for a Christian is not the absence of tribulation. In the midst of tribulation, Christian peace is confidence in God.

Longsuffering: Though contemporary translators prefer "patience," the literal "longsuffering" expresses the meaning better. The term refers less to patience under adverse circumstances than to suffering the follies and cruelties of one's fellowman. In the New Testament the term frequently refers to God's attitude toward man.

Gentleness, a kindly disposition. It is comparatively easy to be gentle when one is not in pain, physical or moral. Goodness, a Biblical word, not found in secular Greek. Gentleness is not always practical. Goodness is.

Faith, here emphasizes "faithfulness," rather than "belief." The two cannot be separated from each other or from their cognate "obedience."

Meekness, the most unpopular Christian virtue, possibly because the most misunderstood. It does not imply greasy servility, but willingness to learn, consideration for one's neighbor, acceptance of the divine will of God.

Temperance, Self-control. Mastry over all one's desires. In Paul's thinking, every duty is rooted in Truth, every Truth develops into a duty. The two are not separate.

The chapter ends with a list of noble qualities showing what results when a person "walks in the Spirit."

We live in the Spirit by God's arrangement by means of the gift of the Spirit of conversion, but we walk in the Spirit as a matter of personal volition, taking each step in dependence upon Him. If one is walking thus, he will not be desirous of vain glory.

Walking in the Spirit. Galatians is addressed to people who know the meaning of Christian Faith. The Galatians have accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord. They had examined their lives, but repented of their sins, and has received baptism.

Walking in the Spirit. Walking is an old familiar, beautiful term from the Bible for daily life. In the opening pages of scripture we read that Enoch walked with God. His faith made glorious the humble life of each day, for he walked with God.

Walking in the Spirit. Who is the Spirit. The Spirit is the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. That answer, though true, is not very helpful. The Spirit is both Christ's presence in your life and your response of faith to divine grace. It is hard to tell, as you read Galatians, when Paul is talking about the Holy Spirit, "Meaning God's reach for you", and when He is talking about your spirit "meaning your reach for God." The spirit is a fact in Christian experience.

Walking in the Spirit. Live each moment with the knowledge that Christ is present, above you, all around you, within you. This is the meaning of the Holy Spirit, that God whose glory the Heaven of Heavens cannot contain, yet lives in the life of His earthly Son. We have that Son living within each of us. Live with God. Walk in the Spirit.

THE WAGES OF SIN

The facts concerning the salvation of the soul of man and living a life true to our creator are often scoffed at by those who wish to follow the way of least resistance and indulge in the kind of living considered popular by the majority of people today. Those of the world say christianity is old fashioned and even many church members of today propose to find a new and better way than that which condemns sin.

The way of sin, however, is older than the formation of Adam and was instigated by satan himself. Though he was only a created angel, the scripture says he was an anointed cherub before the throne of God. He became exalted in himself because of his beauty and aspired to have power equal with God and began to be rebellious. Because of his iniquity he was cast out of heaven and was no longer one of God's angels, Ezekiel 28:11-15; Isaiah 14:12-17.

Satan began his campaign to destroy that which God had made in His own image when he tempted Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden. Adam and Eve were permitted to eat of every tree in the garden except the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. God told Adam they were not to eat of it for in the day they did, they would surely die, Genesis 2:16,17. God spoke here of one of His thousand year days, II Peter 3:8, and was also speaking of a physical death. This curse of a physical death has followed man since that day. No descendant of Adam has ever lived out one of God's thousand year days.

The third chapter of Genesis tells us the serpent was more subtle than any beast of the field. The Hebrew word which has been translated into English as serpent has been used in other places in the Bible to mean something entirely different from which our English word would denote. What ever animal is called a serpent here, he allowed satan to use him in talking to Eve. Because of the cunning persuasion, Eve ate of the forbidden tree and sin entered into the human race.

Genesis 3:14 says God told the serpent he was cursed above all cattle and beasts of the field then in verse 15 is the first promise given to man of a Savior. God put a curse upon satan as though He were talking to the serpent. In Revelation 12:9,15; 20:2 satan is called the dragon and the serpent so we see satan carrying the serpent's name even to his end. Adam and Eve were made to leave the garden to till the ground from which he had been made. God also placed a curse upon the ground because of Adam's transgression that it should bring forth thorns and thistles. Sin does bring terrible consequences. It has brought sorrow all through the ages and will do so even to the millenium with Christ. Then after the judgment those who have followed satan will be cast into the lake of fire where they will be burned up as stubble, Malachi 4:1.

Even though satan has continued to lead mankind to rebel against God, I Peter 5:8, God kept His promise to send a Savior to make a way for man to return to God. John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Wages of Sin (cont.)

God gave us all a right of choice in whether we follow Him or satan. Joshua 24:15 says, "Choose you this day whom ye will serve," and in I Kings 18:21 we read, "How long halt ye between two opinions? If the Lord be God, follow Him." Throughout the Bible God gives a clear outline of how we should live, "But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." Isaiah 1:16-20.

There have been many versions given by man which try to allow people to live in sin yet in the end escape the consequences. Jesus came to this earth and gave His life on the cross to make a way whereby man might be saved from a life of sin. There is no other way for the salvation of man's soul, Acts 4:10-12. All other ways of life will bring not only a tragic end to this life but after the judgment, death to the soul in the lake of fire.

Since eternal life comes only through Christ, let us look at some of the words used to describe the final end of the wicked. Romans 6:23 reads, "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." The wages of sin are death—death means the extinction of anything, destruction, spiritual and eternal ruin. Ezekiel 18:4 says, "The soul that sinneth, it shall die". To die is to expire, to lose life, to cease to exist, or to perish. When we consider these two verses together we see God is not speaking here of a physical death; it is the soul that sins and because of unrepented sin it shall die. The physical body, which dies because of the curse placed upon Adam and his decendants, shall return to dust, Genesis 3:19; 1 Corinthians 15:22: but the soul will sleep in the grave until the resurrection, Daniel 12:2. In the resurrection the soul will be called forth in a new body, I Corinthians 15:42-44, to stand before God in the judgment where every deed whether good or bad will be judged, Ecclesiastes 12:14. Just one unrepented sin-just one untruth, whether great or small-just to refuse to let Jesus be your Savior is enough to cause the soul to be cast into the lake of fire, I John 3:4. Another word used in connection with the future of the wicked is destroy or destroyed. To destroy means to ruin utterly, consume, dissolve, to put an end to, or to do away with. In Psalms 37:38 we find, "But the transgressors shall be destroyed together: the end of the wicked shall be cut off," and in Psalms 145:20, "The Lord preserveth all them that love Him: but all the wicked will He destroy." Psalm 37:20 uses the words perish and consume to describe the end of the wicked. To perish means to suffer an untimely death, to be destroyed, to pass from existence, or to come to nothing. To consume means to destroy as by burning, to eat or drink

Some believe Romans 8:29,30; Ephesians 1:5,11 to mean God has chosen some to be saved and has already decreed others to be lost but John 3:16 says who so ever will may have eternal life. The Greek Lexicon says to foreknow means to hope beforehand or to resolve. To predestinate is to preordain, predetermine, or to give a definite direction. Our scripture reference also says those He has predestinated, He has also called. God's word is a written road map so clearly marked that no one needs to miss the way, Isaiah 35:8. God does not want any to perish but that all should come to repentance, II Peter 3:9, neither will He send anyone to destruction. Anyone who is cast into the lake of fire will have been cast there because of his own choice of the way he lived.

One of the main verses used to teach eternal torment is found in Revelation 14:11 where it reads, "And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up forever and ever: and they have no rest day nor night, who worship the beast and his image, and whosoever receiveth the mark of his name. "First, let us notice verse 10 ends with a colon which makes our present verse belong to the people of that verse. The latter part of verse 11 also identifies it with the people who have taken the mark of the beast. Verse 11 also says, "The smoke of their torment." The word smoke, in the Greek, is the same here as the one used in Acts 2:19 where the phrase is "vapor of smoke." We again find the same word vapor in James 4:14 where it says life is like a vapor which appears for a little while then vanishes away. The English dictionary says a vapor is, "any light, cloudy substance in the air as smoke or fumes; that which is fleeting and unsubstantial." It also gives as one of its definitions for smoke, "Fume, vapor, dust, etc., resembling smoke. "This smoke - or vapor of smoke - will ascend up for ever and ever. The Greek New Testament reads, "Goes up to the ages of the ages." The first word, ages, in the Greek is a strong expression meaning forevermore. The second word ages gives it even a stronger expression meaning forever and ever. This vapor of smoke which appears a little while as it ascends will vanish forever, never to be seen again. Our verse also says, "They have no rest day nor night." Day when used with the word night means from sunrise to sunset. Revelation 22:5 says there will be no night in eternity. Again, let us refer to the Greek New Testament which reads respite instead of rest. Respite means rest but also means refreshment or cessation from labor. The judgments of God upon the ungodly in the end time (just before the millennium) will be one right

Another scripture often used to teach eternal torment is the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, Luke 16:19-31. This is a parable and the interpretation must correspond with the rest of the Bible. Parables illustrate a truth and are not meant to be used to establish a doctrine. Jesus did not state the spiritual status of either man-He only said one was rich and the other was a beggar. He was bringing the contrast between the Jews (the rich man) and the Gentiles (Lazarus). The rich man died—the Jews ceased to be a nation favored by God when they rejected Jesus as their Messiah and in that fallen state, they plunged into many torments. Lazarus died and went to bosom—not to heaven. The gentiles who die to self and accept the Messiah who was rejected by the Jews are made heirs to all of God's promises made to Abraham and his descendants. The Jews said, "We be Abraham's seed," John 8:33, also in John 8:39 they said, "Abraham is our father." In this parable, the rich man calls to his father Abraham and in verse 25 that relationship is acknowledged with, "Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime (the Jewish dispensation) receivedst thy good things." Now Lazarus is comforted. The rich man said he had five brethren. Judah had five brethren. The names of Leah's six sons were Ruben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar and Zebulon. Jesus arose from the dead vet the Jews did not believe in Him any more than they did Moses and the prophets. This parable is a prophecy Jesus gave to the Jews describing the closing of the Jewish dispensation and the ushering in of the times of the gentiles into the promises God gave to His people.

after the other with no refreshing pause between them.

This verse belongs to that end time.

Now let us look at some of the meanings of the words translated into the English word hell. According to Strongs Concordance, all places in the Old Testament where the English uses the word hell, it is translated from the Hebrew word sheol. Sheol means "hades, the grave or the world of the dead (as if a subterranean retreat)."

There are three words in the New Testament we wish to notice—all translated into the word, hell.

- 1. Hades—this word seems to carry an added meaning in the Greek to that of the Hebrew. Besides the Hebrew meaning (above paragraph) the Greek says "powers of the unseen world, the invisible world, deep degradation." For Luke 16:23 the Greek designates deep degradation. When Jesus told Peter, "Upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hades (hell) shall not prevail against it," Matthew 16:18, He meant the powers of the unseen world shall not prevail against the truth of Peter's declaration. The word hades is also used where Jesus compared Capernaum with Sodom, Matthew 1123. All the places in the Book of The Revelation where the word hell is used, it has been translated from the word hades.
- 2. There is one place in the New Testament where the word hell comes from the word tartarus, II Peter 2:4, where it means deepest abyss. It is speaking of the place where Jesus went to preach to the spirits in prison (the created race from Genesis 1:27) that they might have a chance to believe on Him (I Peter 3:19,20) the same as Adam's race.
- 3. The third word is gehenna which means valley of Hinnom. The valley later was called Ge-Hinnom and eventually became known as Gehenna. Another name for this same place is Tophet-said to have been derived from the drums used to drown the screams of the children who were made to pass through the fire during their pagan worship. The valley of Hinnom was the boundary line between Judah and Benjamin and at one time was a place of gardens watered by springs which fed the stream flowing in the bed of the ravine. It was on the lower part of the Mount of Olives, called the Mount of Corruption in 1 Kings 23:13, where Solomon erected high places for Molech and other gods to please his foreign wives, 1 Kings 11:7, 8. Later idolatrous kings revived the worship or Molech. Here Ahaz and Manesseh made their children pass through the fire. In the twelfth year of the reign of King Josiah, II Chronicles 34:4, 5, he purged the valley from the worship of Molech by rendering it unclean. To do this he broke down the altars, opened the tombs of Molech's priests. spread their bones over the valley and burned them. This ceremonially unclean valley became the common cesspool of the city and its sewage was carried off by the waters of Kidron. It is said this is the place where the gehenna fire was kept alive to not only burn the offal and filth of Jerusalem but also to consume the bodies of executed criminals and the carcasses of the animals slain for sin offerings (read Hebrews 13:11). Around the outer edges of that which had not yet been pushed into the fire, it was infested with worms. The Greek in this place says a gnawing worm. As long as this fire was continuously fed it continued to burn and the worms continued to feed. Some believe the gehenna fire to be figurative of an eternal torment for the wicked. Let us note-this fire burned as long as it was continuously fed but when the Jews were dispersed and no longer kept the fire going, the fire burned

out and the worms died. While Jesus was on earth He upheld the law given to Moses. He healed the leper in Matthew 8:2-4 and told him to show himself to the priest and offer the gifts required by Moses. When they brought the woman taken in adultry to Him, John 8:3-11, Jesus did not tell them to not stone her. He only said to let those without sin do it. This is also the reason Jesus used the gehenna fire as a subject in talking to the desciples.

Under the law punishment for certain offences was to cut off a hand or a foot and criminals were cast into the gehenna fire. When Jesus gave His life on the cross, He fulfilled the Law given to Moses and brought into effect the Law of Grace. We no longer practice cutting off hands or feet as it is not a part of the new law. Therefore, since that part of the scripture in both Matthew 18:6-10 and Mark 9:42-48 are applied to the age as under the law; we must also apply the part about the gehenna fire to that age.

The lake which God shall prepare for the devil and his angels as well as for the destroying of all the wicked will burn with fire and brimstone. Brimstone is of a sulfuric composition and burns with a blue flame but it is not an eternal flame. Sodom and Gomorrah were burned with brimstone and fire, Genesis 19:24-29, yet they were so completely consumed that the only way their places are located is geographically. Their smoke went up as the smoke of a furnace and is seen no more.

Revelation 20:10 tells us the devil will be cast into the lake of fire then verses 11-15 of the same chapter give us a word picture of the dead of all ages standing before God for judgment. "Whosoever was not found in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire", verse 15. But the fearful, and unbelieving, and abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death", (death of the soul and the resurrected body), Revelation 21:8.

Eternal tormentism was not taught by the early church fathers but sprang from sinister sources of the Orient, Egypt and Persia. It reached its climax under Greek Platonism and began to make its way into Christian doctrines about 190 A.D. However it was not dominant in belief until about the sixth century. John Wycliff and his followers taught that in death man is in an unconscious sleep until the resurrection.

Pope Leo X from 1513-1521 upheld the erronius doctrines of the immortal soul and eternal tormentism. (It is the body which shall possess immortality in the resurrection, not the soul). But the Pope threatened punishment to those who would teach other than that which he upheld.

In 1877 a chain of developments prompted noted speakers to publish articles declaring, The Bible no where teaches an inherent immortality; but teaches that it is the object of redemption to provide and impart it. They declared those who will not respond to God's call will perish totally and everlastingly.

Gladstone declared the doctrine of eternal torment crept into the church through the back door, though wholly unknown to the scriptures.

"For the wages of sin is DEATH; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord", Romans 6:23. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not PERISH, but have everlasting life", John 3:16.
