

Scott County Population Statistics – 2015

Age Statistics

As of 2015, Scott County had an estimated population of 141,660 people. Between 2014 and 2015, the county's population grew by 1.4 percent, adding 1,988 people. As such, Scott County was the sixthlargest and second-fastest growing county in the state of Minnesota. Despite a slight set-back between 2009 and 2010, Scott County's population has grown steadily over the past decade. More specifically, between 2005 and 2015, the county grew by 19.2 percent, adding more than 22,800 people (see Figure 1). Comparatively, the state population grew by 10.0 percent.





Over the past decade, Scott County's older populations have witnessed the fastest growth. For example, between 2005 and 2015, those 65 years of age and older grew by 104.2 percent, adding over 6,800 people. This made those 65 years of age and older the fastest-growing age group during that time. Those between the ages of 55 and 64 years grew by 79.7 percent, adding over 7,200 people. As such, those between the ages of 55 and 64 years were the largest-growing age group during that time.

Even with the accelerated aging of Scott County's population, those 65 years of age and older made up less than one-tenth of the total population in 2015. At the other end of the spectrum, those between 0 and 24 years of age make up

over 36 percent of the total population. Between 2005 and 2015, those between the ages of 0 and 17 years expanded by 19.0 percent, while those between the ages of 18 and 24 years grew by 3.8 percent (see Table 1).

Disability Statistics

As of 2015, Scott County had an estimated 11,349 people with a reported disability. That makes up approximately 8.1 percent of the county's total population. While incidence of a reported disability increases significantly for those 65 years of age and older, the largest number of those with a disability in Scott County are between the ages of 35 and 64 years. Tables 3 through 8 break down the county's disability population by reported disability type.
