Hi friends,

The following is just a quick summary of each preacher's message during that special week:

Monday - Kent Price, First Christian Church

Jesus quotes the Old Testament all the time! Jesus did just that when a Pharisee asked, "Teacher, what is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind (Duet. 6:5). This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself (Lev. 19:18).' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments" (Mt. 22:36-40). Someone once said that the greatest commandment is one of the first commandments in the Bible, and the 2nd greatest commandment is one of the last commandments in the Bible. These two commandments take care of everything in between.

Tuesday – Brett Rinehart, First Baptist Church

Which commandment is the most important? It is "love the Lord your God." When you focus on God, other things melt away (Mark 12:28). "Love your neighbor as yourself" – this is God working through us (Mark 12:31). Love from the Holy Spirit flows through us (Matthew 22:40, Mark 12:41). We can make a difference when living out the principles that Jesus teaches. [Thanks to Susan for her notes as I could not be present]

Wednesday - Dave Powel, Calvary Assembly of God

When we aren't in church, we are still disciples – still following -still His followers. First Thessalonians 6 tells us to rejoice always, pray, yield to the Holy Spirit, head God's word, and discern God's Word. Let's hold firm to what is good and do our best to remain blameless.

Thursday – Jeremiah Jasper, Woodford Memorial United Methodist Church

Why did Jesus wash his disciples' feet? Because it was a means of grace. In doing so, Jesus displayed humility and servanthood. And he served a comeuppance to the disciples who

lacked a humble, servant-like attitude. Jesus' action was a symbol of our role in the body of Christ. Many times, over the years, I notice people who don't take communion when I serve it. In speaking with them after the service, I asked them why they didn't participate. Nine times out of ten they tell me, "Because I don't feel worthy." I tell them, "It's not about you – it's about Him!"

Friday – Jason Brandon, First Church of Christ

The cross is the victory of Christ. That victory began in the garden when Jesus prayed, "Not my will but your will be done." In today's world, there is less difference between the church and the world. Is the Holy Spirit doing anything? Today's faith is often about pleasing self instead of pleasing God, and too many churches often do not live for Jesus. Don't let your faith become a fair-weathered affection. 
