AAG Haus Walk This Weekend

With four private residences, the West Amana Blacksmith Shop and a communal kitchen on the Amana Arts Guild's Holiday Haus Walk this Saturday and Sunday, we will be able to see and experience a true Amana Colony Christmas.

The AAG Haus walk is \$15. Tickets may be purchased at any one of the homes and at the Amana Arts Guild Gallery on Main in Amana. The walk is Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sunday noon to 4 p.m.

The AAG Christmas Haus Walk features:

Aaron and Shana Schaefer home, East Amana. Built in 1882 this former communal kitchen has been fully renovated and restored as a single family home with the specific intention to reincorporate features from the original layout. The kitchen and dining space was returned to the original location and the original staircase reemerged after 70 years of hiding in a cupboard. The main hallways in the original communal home will once again be used as intended but so many updates and finishing touches have been added to make this a comfortable, contemporary dwelling. Members of the Schaefer family have lived here since 1911, including Kenny and Isabella, Aaron's grandparents.

Saturday visit the Tyler Stockman and Allison Momany home in Middle Amana. Known as the "Trumpold House" in Middle Amana, Marlene Trumpold is a resident in this historic home along with her grand-daughter, Allison, husband Tyler and their sons, Marlene's great grandsons. Remodeling the home in 2020-21, the family has made it truly their own with beautiful finishing touches perfect for their active lives. Christmas decorations include a Weihnachtspyramid made of 12 different woods by Dr. Tim Momany, Allison's father. The house is open Saturday only.

The West Amana home of Dr. David Fox at 615 D Street was constructed in 1862. Located on West's quiet back street, Gus Neumann lived there for many years, but in the late 1990s it became a rental home. Dr. Fox who recently moved to West Amana has made it his very own creating a space that reflects his family history and love for antiques. He made many changes to the frame house, but Dr. Fox has incorporated his own unique style with antiques from his Pennsylvania Dutch heritage.

The High Amana home of Gordon Kellenberger created and decorated by Gordon and his late wife, Deanna, is a loving tribute to their art and craft with so many pieces from their collection of hand made folk art and Amana colony antiques. Featured in the Sunday Cedar Rapids Gazette last week, the Kellenberger home is a one-of-akind family residence that celebrates Amana Colony art.

The West Amana blacksmith shop will be open for tours with the metal working tools and artifacts donated by the family of the late Bill Metz, Middle Amana tinsmith, on display there. This functional blacksmith shop is a must see on your tour and will be the site for blacksmithing classes.

Also this year come tour the Communal Kitchen


Join friends at 6 p.m. on Friday. Dec. 1 for caroling in Amana as you sing your way to the Tannenbaum Forest.
