Our plea for support for the 2021 Park Fund Drive did not fall on deaf ears. I am excited to report that to date we have raised \$5,300 of the \$5,600 needed for the annual budget. I have been a member of CHCA for decades and I am unaware

of our ever raising so much money in such a short time. To all of you who so generously responded to this drive, all the CHCA Board and Park Committee members thank you. Some residents even signed up to help at the park, and that is just as rewarding. The more volunteers the easier the load (think gravel spreading, painting and weed pulling).

We received donations from 105 residents and former residents. This represents 1/6 of the neighborhood supporting the park. For the park to remain sustainable over the years, more residents will need to participate. While we are clearly close to our financial goal, bringing the donor goal to at least 1/3 of the 600-home neighborhood would accomplish that.

Towards this end, one of our neighbors, who asked to be anonymous, has established a Challenge Fund covering a two-year period of fundraising. For the remainder of this 2021 fund drive, and lasting until the end of May, the challenge will be to raise the number of donors contributing to the park. We thank the folks who have already generously donated, and we direct our appeal to new donors (those not having contributed to date and those who have never contributed).

### The Challenge Fund

For each dollar contributed we will receive \$2 from our challenger! In other words:

\$10 becomes \$30 \$25 becomes \$75 \$50 becomes \$150 \$100 becomes \$300 and so on!

To qualify for the matching funds, we need to receive your gift by May 31, 2021. Make Challenge Fund donations payable to CHCA and mail to CHCA, P.O. Box 17055, Pittsburgh, PA 15235 or donate at CH-CA.org.

Next year's Challenge Fund will start in January 2022 and be applicable to all contributions. Tell me you are not amazed by this generosity! While we will clearly go over our financial goal for this year, the excess funds will be used to provide a reserve fund to draw upon for future emergencies (tree issues, equipment damage, fence repair, etc.)

Thank you, Crescent Hills residents, and especially thank you, Challenge Donor.

### **Plant Sale**

Due to the success of last year's prepay and delivery plant sale, we are repeating that Covid model for 2021, except the orders will not be placed online. An order form with pricing information is included in this newsletter for that purpose. We can only deliver to streets within Crescent Hills.

Our plants come from the local Bridge's Greenhouse in Plum. The plants are strong and healthy and locally grown. We will again be selling the popular Tumbling Tom patio tomatoes and the Citrosa plant, which repels mosquitos. While we are not offering impatiens this year due to a poor crop, we have added five additional plants. The flowers and vegetables come by

packs, flats, individual pots and hanging baskets. Each flat contains 8 packs of either 32 or 48 plants. The colored flier of the plants is nice to see but expensive to print so you will only find the flier on the CH-CA.org website in the Spring 2021 newsletter. The flier indicates which plants prefer sun or shade and which "may be" deer resistant, but only the deer know this for sure.

You will receive your plants by or before Saturday, May 15, depending on whether that Saturday is a rain-free day. As we get closer to the date, we will contact all folks who have placed orders to confirm the day of the front-yard delivery. Orders must be received by May 8 and paid for in advance.

## Tree Planting – May 8, 2021 Crescent Hills Park



#### **Redbud Tree**

On May 8, 10:00 a.m., the Penn Hills Shade Tree Commission will plant a Redbud Tree in our park. In time, that tree should look like the above picture, without the pictured landscaping. Later this summer, perhaps at the above-mentioned Labor Day Picnic, we will dedicate that tree in the memory of Marion Decker, the first president of Crescent Hills Civic Association (then known as Crescent Hills Women's Club). We are doing this at the request of another generous and anonymous donor to our park. This tree will be planted near the outside left corner of the sports court. Later in the year and before fall, we will plant two more Redbud trees opposite the first but inside the field. Our park will be even more beautiful than it already is. You are welcome to attend the May 8 planting and learn the proper way to plant a tree.

# Park - Dumping Incident

A dumping incident occurred at the park on April 15 and the actions of the perpetrator were caught on our recently installed cameras. Police were called and we were able to produce the pictures of the activity. The person who dumped their bicycles in our park will receive a citation. We will provide additional evidence if needed. Penn Hills amended its dumping ordinance in 2019 to allow for fines up to \$2,000 plus cleanup costs. Our municipal manager was quoted at the time that "[D]umping invites litter which poisons our community and encourages blight." We agree with that sentiment and will do whatever it takes to stop the vandalism to our park.

#### **CH Park Reminders**

- No park or lot use after dark
- ▶ No fireworks in the park, not even "sparklers".
- ▶ Dogs must be leashed; clean up after your dog. Bag containers and garbage cans are at each end of the park.
- ► Call 911 if you see illegal activities, fighting or equipment being damaged. It's safer not to correct offenders yourself.
- ▶ Port-a-John (located near end of parking lot) is serviced every week by the Pittsburgh Potty Company (For "nature calls," not "garbage hauls!") Do not put trash in the Port-a-John.


Storytime in the Park is back starting May 1 with a few changes, and we can't wait!

# A Good Friend and Neighbor – Mary Lois Verrilla






