## Biography

William R. Eick, age 91 of Harbor Beach, passed away Wednesday, August 10, 2022 at his home, under hospice care. He was born on August 29, 1930 in Lapeer to the late Walter & Lela (Ronald) Eick. Bill was baptized on September 21, 1930 and confirmed on June 13, 1943 at Christ Lutheran Church in Goodrich. He and Shirley Swinehart were united in marriage on June 19, 1954 in Hadley, she preceded him in death on November 16, 1997. Bill worked at Harbor Beach High School from 1953-1999. He assisted with the FFA program for 7 years, and 39 years as the Guidance Counselor.
