AT FEATHER LAKE

We re-opened Feather Lake to the public September 4. Within a week, the lake was dry. We were all set to close up shop again when a small mid-September storm put some water back in the lake. It was followed by a late-September downpour that brought the water level to 3.16 feet deep.

Prospects for a fall visitor season are much brighter now. Can you help staff Feather Lake this fall? Please contact John Sproul (747-8663, jsproul@utep.edu) if you can put in a Saturday morning or Sunday afternoon greeting visitors and keeping an eye on our sanctuary. Act now before these coveted opportunities are all spoken for.

Thanks go to Eagle Scout candidate Evan Longpré and his fellow Boy Scouts in Troop 4 who took part in Evan's Eagle Scout service project at Feather Lake on August 14 and 22. As many of you know, a low inner berm winds through the basin. (Seen from the air, it forms the outline of a bird.) After the disturbance associated with removal of cattails and bulrush from the basin in 2004, non-native salt cedars popped up in many locations amongst the native vegetation on this berm. The scouts worked hard clearing a trail along the berm and removing numerous salt cedars.

No doubt the scouts' efforts have inspired you to help with habitat management at Feather Lake. You can act on that inspiration at our next workday. It takes place **Sat., December 4**, an afternoon session starting at **2 p.m.** Come out, work a few hours, then enjoy a beautiful setting at the end of the day.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave. Hours are 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays and 2 p.m. to dusk on Sundays. Admission is free.


After a long, dry spring and summer, we hope



Swainson's Hawk & USPS

Several weeks ago I inquired about the Swainson's Hawk - often seen in the EI Paso area flying high and looking for something to eat.



I asked if they attacked dogs, cats, etc., since we have a Yorkie that we let out into our backyard. We always check the sky before letting "Brutus" out. The reply I received from EP/TPAS was that Swainson's Hawks feed on insects and small rodents and that we shouldn't worry about some hawk wanting to "snack" on our dog.

As a letter carrier for the U.S. Postal Service (and former student of Mrs. Lucretia Chew's English II class at El Paso Tech High School in 1968) At msnbc.com, I came across an article, "Hawk Attacks Postal Worker In Canada."

Several years ago I was attacked by a certain mockingbird on my postal route. I called animal control to see what could be done about this bird. I was told that I had better not harm it because it is the State Bird of Texas! However, a small water gun discouraged further attacks. Since then, I not only watch out for dogs, I also look to the sky.
