Bring your questions to this unique opportunity with the leaders of our City. All questions will be taken on 3x5 cards for easy facilitation.



DID YOU KNOW...?

Oceanside is finally starting to preserve some of its historic buildings! Although many have already been torn down to modernize the town, folks are realizing the past is worth saving.

The first is on Pierview (former dry cleaner) and is one of the city's oldest buildings constructed in 1888. It has been a hardware store, a boarding house on the second floor, and then addition of a 3rd floor for an actual hotel. Renovations include earthquake strengthening and removing the 1950's stucco facade to the original brick for this new boutique hotel.

The second is the old Blade-Tribune newspaper building on Seagaze. Originally designed by renowned architect Irving Gill in 1936, like the hotel its façade was stuccoed to make it look more "modern" during the 1950's. Other Gill buildings are the original City Hall built in 1934 (later became the Fire & Police station) and the Resource Center on Division St.

A third is the Dolphin Hotel now under renovation. This 1927 hotel will maintain the exterior design features but the interior will be brand new. It used to be one of the "cool" hotels for Hollywood people. Eventually, it may be renamed to one of its original names The Keisker or The DeWitt Hotel.

LOCAL DEVELOPMENTS:

Apotheque New Wine Bar – You may have noticed that one of our other unique older buildings, that houses the Apotheque Spa and Succulent Garden, has also received a liquor license to serve wine and have entertainment on the back patio!

Sadly the Succulent Garden has moved to Carlsbad due to the affects of the years of construction on Cleveland, but will soon be replaced with a cool and interesting spot to enjoy beverages and listen to music in a rustic, elegant setting! This is a wonderful addition to the many improvements that are coming to Oceanside!

Pier renovations - The Pier has been undergoing renovation, including concrete bridge patching and Pier deck replacement. The last quadrant is being completed now, and should take about three months (Mar-Apr). In addition, work has begun to replace decking at the end of the Pier around Ruby's Restaurant and will be completed one section at a time to minimize disruption to this popular attraction.
