

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

STAND UP FOR WHAT IS RIGHT

King Zedekiah appears today as weak and as ineffectual as Pontius



the decision of what to do with the troublesome prophet, he allows his princes to take charge: "He is in your power" (Jeremiah 38:5). They throw him in a cistern and leave him to die. Zedekiah, given the opportunity to take a stand and defend the words of the prophet, steps aside to let him die.

But then the king reconsiders. It is the influence of one person, a foreigner, one of his servants, who pushes him to do the right thing. Ebedmelech, an Ethiopian eunuch, is Jeremiah's savior. To stand up to his

master, the king of Judah, must have taken great courage. He put his life on the line. But he acted. He spoke up. Sometimes all it takes is one morally upright person who has the guts to stand up to power and move an uncertain leader to act justly and mercifully.



Perhaps this is what Jesus is trying to tell His disciples when he says, He has come to bring division. The world is no longer a pristine Eden. The world is full of evil-immoral people who actively exercise it and indifferent people who passively allow it. The kingdom of God cannot have either of these. Doing good demands standing up to those who do evil and to those who allow evil to be done. It may mean opposing a leader or a superior. It may mean opposing a friend or family member. A divided household is better than a corrupt one.

The Feast of St. Bartholomew, August 24th

Saint Bartholomew was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus. He has also been identified as Nathanael or Nathaniel, who appears in the Gospel of John when introduced to Jesus by Philip (who would also become an apostle). The Roman Catholic Church honors him on August 24th.

Of the many miracles claimed to have been performed by Bartholomew before and after his death, two very popular ones are known by the townsfolk of the small Italian island of Lipari.

The people of Lipari celebrated his feast day annually. The tradition of the people was to take the solid silver and gold statue from inside the Cathedral of St Bartholomew and carry it through the town. On one occasion, when taking the statue down the hill towards the town, it suddenly became very heavy and had to be set down. When the men carrying the statue regained their strength, they lifted it a second time. After another few seconds, it got even heavier. They set it down and attempted once more to pick it up. They managed to lift it but had to put it down one last time. Within seconds, walls further downhill collapsed. If the statue had been able to be lifted, all the townspeople would have been killed.

During World War II, the Fascist regime looked for ways to finance their activities. The order was given to take the silver statue of Saint Bartholomew and melt it down. The statue was weighed, and it was found to be only a few grams. It was returned to its place in the Cathedral of Lipari. In reality, the statue is made from many kilograms of silver and it is considered a miracle that it was not melted down.



RECITATION OF THE ROSARY: Join your fellow parishioners in praying the Rosary after the 9 a.m. Mass on weekdays and Saturdays.


EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION: Held the First Friday of every month at 1 p.m. Please join us when you are able.
