

Purpose of Goal-Setting Process

- Link the most important, highest priority things for the City to accomplish with the resources needed to do so.
 - To do this, Council goal-setting needs to drive the budget process, not follow it.
 - This means starting the budget process with Council identifying top priorities.

Benefits

- Via the Preliminary Budget, staff can better recommend realistic implementation measures as well as identify the resources – in terms of time, staff and finances – needed to accomplish them.
- This becomes the basis of an effective, practical budget that can make a positive difference to the City and its citizens.

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Three Keys to Success

- Identify most important, highest priority things to accomplish for the community
- Prepare work programs for top priorities as part of Preliminary Budget process
- Report on results



• Identify Top Priorities

- The City can accomplish anything
- What it can't accomplish is everything
 - Council leadership is essential in setting goals with a sense of importance and priority that will drive the resource allocation process.
 - And that's what budgets are all about: making trade-offs between goals and resources.

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Tough Fiscal Times and Goal-Setting

- Tendency to think that goal-setting and tough fiscal times are incompatible concepts.
- But it's even more important to focus on key goals in tough times, because the consequence of getting priorities wrong is even greater.



Work Programs

- In preparing Preliminary Budget around top Council goals, essential for clear understanding of what the Council hopes to achieve
- Purpose of work programs is to:
 - Define and scope the adopted goal
 - Ensure clear understanding of the goal so appropriate resources are allocated, and progress measured in achieving it

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
Council said they wanted a swing ... How the City Engineer saw it Parks program's take All the Council wanted



3 Reporting on Results

- Allocating resources and adopting clear plans alone will not provide results: that comes from using those resources in implementing the plan.
- For that reason, ongoing reporting on the status of the "action plan" in concise but meaningful ways to the staff, Council and community is an essential component for success.

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Proposed Process

- Two Steps
 - Council prepares seven "candidate goals"
 - Goal-setting workshop: April 2, 2013

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Sample Goal Statements

- Continue with aggressive efforts to develop permanent, reliable water sources to meet General Plan build-out needs.
- Acquire right-of-way and property for extension of the Railroad Bicycle Trail.
- Adopt a balanced budget that addresses the City's long-term fiscal health and preserves critical services.

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Goal-Setting Workshop: Step 1

- After introduction and process overview, begins with list of proposed goals submitted by Council members, by theme
 - Where similar goals are submitted, HSM Team will draft synthesized goal statements for consideration



Goal-Setting Workshop: Next Steps

- Review goals for clarity and understanding
- Finalize "menu" of goals for ranking
- Weight, rank and identify "tiers"


Recommended Priority Scale

- Most important, highest priority for the City to achieve over the next two years
- Important goal to achieve
- Address if resources are available
- Defer to next budget for consideration
- O Not a priority goal

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How many points in total?

- Recommend limiting "total points" to focus on priorities
- Suggested target: two points per "menu" goal
 - For example, if 25 goals, 50 points total



Major City Goals

- Most important, highest priority goals for City to achieve over next 5 years
- Detailed "Work Programs" developed for consideration as part of Preliminary Budget

Other Tiers

Other Important Objectives

Important for City to accomplish and resources included in 2013-14 Budget if at all possible


Address as Resources Permit

While desirable to achieve this goal, doing so is subject to current resource availability

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Suggested Criteria for Major City Goals

- Few, clear, and understandable
- High priority and a real commitment
- Require strong Council support sends a message, the "oomph" factor!
- Created in a supportive atmosphere
- Translatable into work programs and employee objectives – things that can be done! (connected to reality)
