Elected as MBCA Secretary in 2009, her responsibilities included drafting Board Meeting Minutes, developing Community Newsletters and participating on various committees in support of community interests. In 2010, she was elected MBCA Treasurer, responsible for the oversight of the finances of the association. Sandy retired from Giant Food. Inc. as Vice President of Human Resources. At Giant. she directed the administration of five company divisions including Training & Management Development, Employment, Personnel Records, Payroll and Benefits. He remained on the faculty for 33 years, with a one year sabbatical back in Baltimore at Johns Hopkins. In addition to his roles as a researcher and educator John served as the Vice Provost for Research in Syracuse and served on several statewide university boards. Before retiring and moving permanently to Delmarva he spent over 2 years at The Wistar Institute in Philadelphia as Vice President for Academic Affairs. John still serves on the IRB, a committee that reviews clinical trial cancer treatments, for the Philadelphia Cancer Treatment Centers of America hospital. John and his family have vacationed in Ocean City for many years and he and Paulette have owned a mid-town condo since 1993. John served on the scholarship committee last year and looks forward to serving the local chapter as a board member.

Questions had been gathered from chapter members prior to the event and questions from the audience were also collected. The forum was well organized, not very contentious, and flowed smoothly. September Speaker



Our speaker was Ronald Pilling of the Jesse Klump Foundation. Mr. Pilling spoke on the suicide crisis in Worcester County. Mr. Pilling provided useful information about the warning signs of suicide, what to do when someone you know may be considering suicide, and many other issues. The session was not depressing and was an "eyeopener" to everyone present.

October Speaker



Our speaker was Mr. Tom Oneto of the Ocean City Aviation Association (OCAA). Tom gave a very interesting presentation on the restoration project involving the Huey UH-1 helicopter that is now on display at the Ocean City Airport. The project involved hundreds of hours of volunteer work and donations from many charitable individuals, as a wreck was transformed into a beautiful aircraft. Tom's assistant, John Sabanosh, is a former Vietnam Huey "dust-off" pilot. John gave a presentation on the role of the Huey as a medical evacuation helicopter during the Vietnam War, and the tumultuous time he spent there. Our chapter members were very appreciative.

Some 160 large space and missile artifacts and 500 smaller space history artifacts are on view at the McDonnell Space Hangar to illustrate the scope of space exploration history as organized around the following four main themes: rocketry and missiles, human spaceflight, applications satellites, and space science. Some of the highlights include:

Space Shuttle Discovery Gemini 7 space capsule Apollo command module Spacelab Laboratory Module *Close Encounters of the Third Kind* Mothership model, used for the filming of the movie of the same name



If you are a History enthusiast, check out some of the exhibits including Dorothy's Ruby Red slippers from *The Wizard of Oz*, or the Blue Wool Coat, part of a suit of regimentals

made for George Washington in 1789, and if transportation is your interest, check out the Red Crown Gasoline Pump among all other exhibits available in the history of more than 60 cars on exhibit at the Smithsonian.
