## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Linden, Texas (the "City"), will meet in the Linden Senior Citizens Center, 507 South Kaufman, Linden, TX 75563 at 6:00 p.m. on the 8th day of March, 2021, to adopt an Ordinance and take such other action as may be deemed necessary to authorize the issuance of the City of Linden, Texas Certificates of Obligation, payable from City ad valorem taxes and net revenues of the waterworks and sewer system of the City, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$2,855,000, bearing interest at any rate or rates, not to exceed the maximum interest rate now or hereafter authorized by law, as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, and maturing over a period of years not to exceed forty (40) years from the date thereof, for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness of the City for all or any part of the cost of renovation and replacement of City water distribution lines, water meters and fire hydrants; a new City water well; and new ground water storage tank and elevated water storage tank; and the cost of professional services incurred in connection therewith.

The public is further hereby notified as follows:

- (a) As of the date of this notice the current principal balance of all outstanding debt obligations of the City is \$745,000.
- (b) As of the date of this notice the combined principal and interest required to pay all outstanding debt obligations of the City on time and in full (which is based on the City's expectations related to the interest due on any variable rate debt of the City) is \$780,637.
- (c) The maximum principal amount of Certificates of Obligation to be issued is \$2,855,000.
- (d) The estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the Certificates of Obligation to be authorized on time and in full is \$4,637,800.
- (e) The estimated interest rate for the Certificates of Obligation to be issued is 2.625% per annum. Such interest rate may vary based on market conditions but will not exceed the maximum legal interest rate.
- (f) The maximum maturity date of the Certificates of Obligation to be authorized is December 31, 2061.

## REGULAR MEETING DECEMBER 14, 2020

The Linden City Council met in regular session on Monday, December 14, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at the Mary Daughety Senior Citizens' Center, 507 S. Kaufman, Cass County, Linden, Texas.

Members present were: Mayor Clarence Burns; City Councilmen Chuck Evans, Mike Berry, James Johnson; and City Councilwoman Mary Dowd; City Councilman Frank Lanier was absent. The following guests were present: Terressa Wall, Algera Anderson, Bob Swisher, Luci Trahan, Christophe Trahan. Robert Luzio, Kevin Payne, and Rebecca Wells.

Mayor Burns swore in the newly elected council members, James Johnson, Chuck Evans, and Mary Dowd before calling the meeting to order.

The Mayor called the meeting to order, Mr. Swisher gave the invocation, and the Mayor welcomed the guests.

Motion by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mrs. Dowd to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. All yeas.

Motion by Mr. Berry, seconded by Mr. Johnson to approve the current bills and bank statements. All yeas.

LEDC Update: Mr. Trahan stated he should have the annual audit reports for the January meeting. He stated the retention wall at 405 S Main had been removed. He presented the council with a copy of the recently amended LEDC budget for their approval. He stated the board had chosen to relocate \$6,500 from the Main Street Programs and Initiatives line item into the Building and Land Acquisition/Development line item to assist with expenses relating to the development of the property at 405 S Main.

Motion by Mrs. Dowd, seconded by Mr. Evans to approve the LEDC budget amendment as presented. All yeas.

Mr. Swisher discussed the MB- MLBPA Grant. He stated the 14 year olds and above have no ball field. He stated a business plan would be needed, but said there should not be any match associated with this grant.

Motion by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mrs. Dowd to continue to explore and work with Linden Together on the MB-MLBPA Grant. All yeas.

Mr. Swisher discussed purchase of a new truck for the street department. He stated the <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ton Dodge is a 2002 model and is not good for towing, etc. He wants to purchase a 1 ton truck and has a bid of \$30,000.00 from Dewey Moore Ford in Hughes Springs. He stated it is a Municipality Program Ford offers and the best deal he had found. He stated the budget would need \$9,000 added to the \$21,000 presently budged for this purchase. He stated it was a 6.2 liter gas(7.3 if 2021 model) work truck with a towing package. He recommended the council approve this bid.

Motion by Mr. Berry, seconded by Mr. Johnson to approve the purchase of the Ford truck proposal and amend the budget. All yeas.

Ms. Anderson stated there were four proposals submitted for the professional services for the Community Development Funds TXCDBG Grant. She stated that GrantWorks had the highest point system.

Motion by Mrs. Dowd, seconded by Mr. Berry to award the professional services contract to Grant Works for the Community Development Funds TXCDBG Grant. All yeas.

Ms. Anderson stated the Linden Library has 20% rise in membership from the past month. She stated that Denise will be ordering new shelving and that grants are being pursued for a computer lab.

Ms. Anderson stated that in January she will be looking at new board members for Main Street. She thanked Mary Dowd and Larry Love for serving on this board for the past four years. She asked the city council to shop local. For the Community Development portion she stated the tree service has completed the park job. She stated the walking path lights have been replaced with led lights and that the tennis courts work at Crow Heath Park is almost complete. She stated he will be back this week or next week to do the wind screens. She stated this job is \$1,000 under budget. She stated the street department workers have redug the trench for better drainage and added the tree service is \$750 under budget. The old Milstep building engineering specs are being worked on. Rebecca Wells with TXDOT spoke to the council about the West Houston Project, stating traffic is less than 250 cars on 4 lanes. She recommends resealing 2 lanes and pavement marking to be done by TXDOT. She stated application should be done in the Spring and that in May or June the seal coat work would be done by TXDOT.

Police Chief Lee went over the monthly police report with the council.

Mr. Luzio stated the crews have been working on leaks, sewer pump issues, and the computer system problems which caused late billing last month. He stated the new fire truck was delayed due to outbreak of covid so it will probably be the end of the year on delivery. He stated the new truck will possibly lower insurance rates.

Mr. Swisher stated the covid relief funds will cover school supplies, police funding for payroll expense, and EMS payments. He said total funding is \$108,000.00

Mayor Burns thanked citizens for spending money in Linden. He stated January 13<sup>th</sup>-February 12<sup>th</sup> is the time period to sign up for the upcoming May election for Mayor/Aldermen.

The council went into executive session.

The council returned from executive session.

Motion by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Johnson to adjourn. All yeas.



## Linden Economic Development Monthly Report to City Council Highlights for the month of December – 2020 Submitted by: Christophe Trahan; Executive Director – LEDC 4A & 4B

- On January 4<sup>th</sup> 2021, LEDC Executive Director Christophe Trahan tenured his resignation to the Linden Economic Development Corporations. Mr. Trahan is leaving the LEDC to become the Executive Director of the Wood County Economic Development Commission where he will be working with a team of Wood County's economic development professionals to improve the quality of life in Wood County by promoting economic development. Mr. Trahan's last day with the LEDC will be January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021.
- The LEDC executed its Chapter 380 Grant Agreement with Calabri Health, LLC and Open Hearts Children and Family Services, LLC on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021. With this agreement in place, the LEDC has issued a grant to Calabri Health for \$25,000 as an incentive for creating eleven full time jobs in Linden by the end of this year and a total of nineteen over the course of the subsequent two years in addition to \$200,000 in capital investments in their new Linden facility.
- LEDC Staff worked diligently over the course of the month of December preparing end-of-year reports to be issued to the USDA and State Comptroller in full compliance with state regulation and USDA Rural Business Economic Grant reporting standards.




