Bullying IS NOT Allowed!

One in five kids is the victim of bullying, and the scars of this abuse are both physical and emotional. Kids who are bullied don't fare as well academically, and they're at higher risk for illnesses such as diabetes and heart disease as adults.

The signs aren't always obvious, so parents need to pay attention. A drop in grades, sudden loss of interest in activities, withdrawal from friends, extra moodiness, and frequent requests for money can all warn that it's time to take action.

Start by talking to your child—and their teachers. Teach nonviolent ways to deal with a bully—like walking away, involve your child in activities outside school, where they can form new friendships.



NEW MOBILE GAMING APP RAISES AWARENESS, COMBATS HUMAN TRAFFICKING

App helps students identify red flags and false leads of traffickers (Excerpts from an article in <u>Presbyterians Today</u>)

A new anime-style gaming app for mobile devices, such as smartphones and tablets, has an extraordinary mission: to keep children and young adults, ages 11 to 14, from becoming victims of human traffickers.

Let's all be aware of the dangers!

Help fight Human Trafficing The Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime, the Department of Education and the White House all felt the ACT app is one of the best tools in educating our children about human trafficking.

The developers worked to strike a balance that isn't "too broad" or "too scary," but one in which the students learn from the characters' stories to be alert and aware at all times.

"As traffickers change their tactics, we hope to stay 10 steps ahead of them by developing new scenes to educate our youth."
