Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

16th Sunday Ordinary Year B

Got enough gas in your tank? People often ask such questions to see if you have enough strength or focus to get work accomplished. Jesus sees the need to have his disciples step away from work for a while to experience a recharge or refresh of their spirits. He tells them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while" (Mk 6:31) Mark's gospel adds two details that highlights the cause of their needing a 'moment' away. Mark writes that "People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat." These two details of 1) the massive crowd 2) not having a chance to eat had been reported already back in Mk chapter 3:20, "again, the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat." So with this second mention of the busy disciples not taking proper time to eat, Jesus stops the ministry clock to have them retreat and be renewed. Jesus does apply this 'necessary recharging' principle to everyone, such as the whole crowd in this chapter 6:30, when he feeds the five thousand, and he will apply it again to them, in Mark 8:1-9 when he miraculously feeds another crowd of four thousand (Yes, Mark and Matthew alone among the gospels record two miracle feedings Mark 6:30-44 & Matt 14:13-21 of 5,000 people and then in Mark 8:1-9 & Matt 15:32-39 of 4,000 people). He knows the crowds are hungry and tired. So, Jesus refreshes them. And He stresses to His disciples the same need to 'retreat and withdraw' in order to be renewed in body and spirit. Which brings up Jesus' constant emphasis that not only our bodies need refreshing, but also our souls. Back in Matthew 4:4 (Deut 8:3), Jesus had taught "One does not live by bread alone". In John 4:32&34 Jesus reminds His disciples that a well-fed soul can sustain a body past normal, physical limits, when He mentioned, "I have food to eat of which you do not know....,My food is to do the will of the one who sent me" So it was not simply 'getting away' that Jesus was commanding of His disciples. He was commanding them to 'get away with HIM'. So just time off from work, doesn't refresh us, unless we can take time off, WITH Him. His Presence and His company is what feeds or boosts our life. Having stepped away from routine and work to be with Jesus, then we can return rejuvenated and ready fully to take up our service and work again with that 'first joy' that we once began with. In an address back on April 4 Pope Francos reminded a group of Latin America seminarians, "Love, our first love, is what has brought us all here today, and keeping it alive is our main obligation" (Clementine Hall Address 4-4-2024) Rekindling one's first love and call from Jesus is what keeps fresh one's heart and soul in His service. So, we must regularly reconnect ourselves to Him through a period of recovery and rest in Him, to regain our first enthusiasm in ministry.

A similar principle of rest/renewal is, "you have to have it, to give it'! If I have not received grace, peace or joy from Christ, then we do not have anything to offer or give anyone else." So, we must take time to receive from God any good that we may feel we offer to someone else. Mother Teresa always told her sisters that in their very active ministry to the neglected poor/sick in the streets of Calcutta, they had to 'fill up with Jesus first!' She would remind them that if they had not spent an hour with Jesus in front of the Tabernacle, every morning, then they ought to stay in the convent. If you haven't sat at the feet of Jesus and received from Him, then don't go out in His Name serving, because you do not have anything to give to the other person!" I imagine this is why companies requires employees to periodically retrain or attend mandatory 'in service' days or pep rallies (I am not saying that they work in that context, but it happens!) However, there is certainly much wisdom in taking time to 'check your tank' and 'refill when needed'. I love how we have such opportunities every day with daily mass, or definitely with our weekend worship (yet a spiritual respite is never any farther away than a 'moment of silence and solitude' that we call prayer anytime and anywhere!) We may not have scheduled Jesus into our daily calendar, but when we do, He has so much to give back to us!
