

William Maxwell Passes After Long Illness

Funeral services for William T. Maxwell, 82, who died Monday evening in his home in Chandler township, were set for Thursday afternoon. Services in the home were set for 1:30 p. m. and in the church at 2 p. m. with the Rev. Winston Thomas officiating.

Burial was to be in Soule Town Cemetery, Chandler township. J. O. Shetler was in charge of funeral arrangements.

Mr. Maxwell had been ill about two years.

He was born in Canada on June 21, 1865, and came to Michigan when still a boy. Truly one of the pioneer settlers, he was one of the first in Chandler township, arriving here almost three-quarters of a century ago.

On January 2, 1885, he was united in marriage with Margaret Alexander, in Chandler. Mrs. Maxwell survives him.

Mr. Maxwell was a member of the Presbyterian church of Chandler township.

Besides his widow, he leaves two sons, Thomas of Pigeon, and Bert of Chandler; one brother, Thomas of Elkton; two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Thompson of Saginaw, and Mrs. Elizabeth Baer of New Baltimore; three grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.
