



# What is the RPP?

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- The Residential Permit Parking Program is designed to enhance the quality of life in neighborhoods experiencing chronic non-resident parking.
  - First designation in April 2002 – University Place
  - Allows residents or visitors with the proper permit to park curbside during designated times.
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



# RPP Criteria

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- Front footage must be at least 75% residential
  - At least 60% of the parking is occupied
  - At least 25% of the parkers are commuters
  - Demonstrate support from neighbors
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



# How to apply for the program?

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- Complete the Application
    - Must be completed by a resident
    - Describe the parking problem
    - One application per block or area
    - Include application fee
  - Circulate the Petition
    - Residents should have 3 opportunities to sign
    - Document attempts to contact on petition
    - List vacant residences on petition
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



# I've applied – What next?

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- Parking and Traffic surveys are conducted
  - Public Hearing held
  - Parking and Traffic Official's recommendation forwarded to City Council
  - City Council approves the designation
  - RPP area becomes effective in 60 days
    - Parking Management installs signs
    - Residents purchase permits
    - Warnings are issued to educate the public
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# Residential Permit Parking in Washington Avenue Corridor

- Available to all single-family residences
    - 8 units or less
  - Can be established on mixed-use blocks
  - Recommend area applications
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

# Residential Permit Parking Signs



- Enforced by:
  - Compliance Officers
  - Police Officers



## RPP Permits

- Decal
    - One per vehicle registered to area address
  - Visitor Hangtags
    - Limit 4 per household
    - Use for different vehicles
  - Service Provider
    - Limit 2 per year
  - One-day Visitor
    - Valid for one-time use
    - Must scratch off date of use
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

# Washington Ave. Parking Benefit District



- Limit 1 permit per PBD address
- RPP permits cannot be used in PBD Area
- Valid for 1 year



# Washington Ave Parking Benefit District

- Addresses within the corridor of 1000' of the corridor not required to meet the 75% residential front footage requirement
