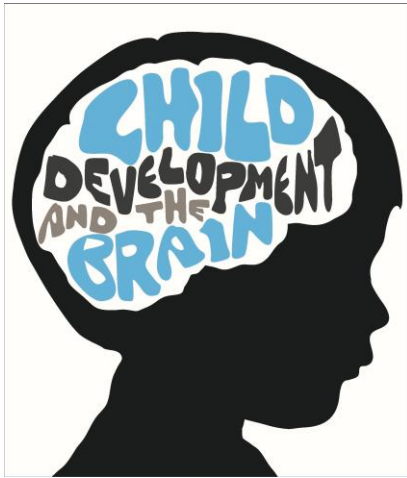

Dr. Bruce McEwen; Professor at Rockefeller University who has studied throughout his prolific career (with over 1000 peer review scientific publications) neuroplasticity, the neural impact of adverse events, stress, recovery and hormonal changes from embryonic development to adult life. He is a member of the National Academy of Science and Medicine.

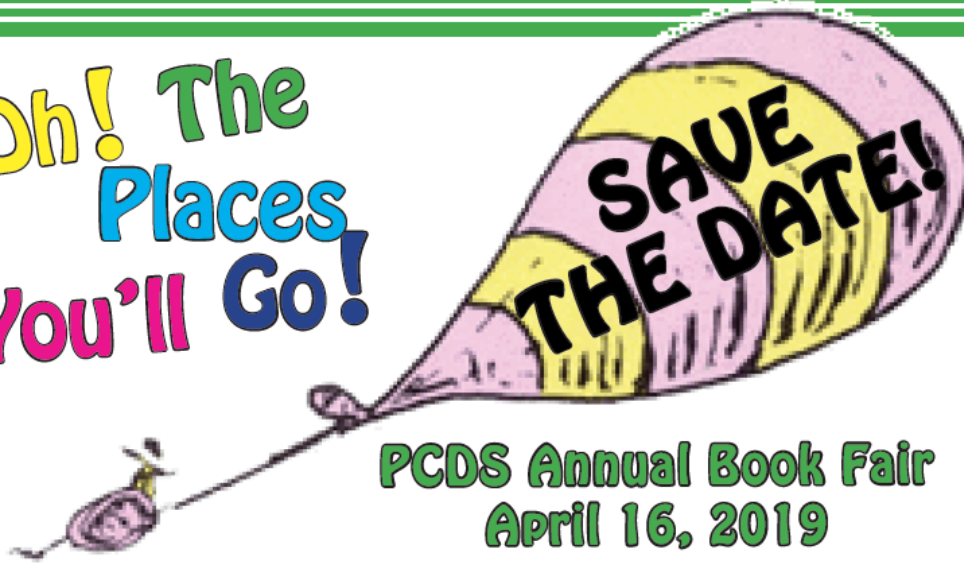
