

RESEARCH METHODS

Rationale

Research is a systematic collection, interpretation and analysis of data. It is an essential process which helps stakeholders to better understand the current situation through evidenced based information and to develop appropriate programs which address the needs of certain issues. The Health Action Information Network responds to the increasing need for information and skills building as the country's development issues continues to evolve through operations research.

Course Description

This course is intended to broaden knowledge, attitude and skills in areas of research and information technology, including its applications for program planning, monitoring and evaluation. The participants are introduced to quantitative (survey) and qualitative (FGDs, ethnography, life stories and content analysis) methods, data processing and evidence based analysis including actual application through fieldwork.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the training course, the participants will be able to:

- Explain concepts, processes and types of research
- Discuss examples of quantitative and qualitative methods
- Demonstrate skills for analyzing qualitative and quantitative methods
- Apply research tools and data processing techniques

Learning Methods

This 14 days course uses combined lectures and experiential learning techniques for practical applications.

Who should attend

This course is open to individuals with background on research involved in academe, professional organizations, local government units, non-government organizations and private corporations.

Course fees

Fees are modified according to the training needs of the participants. A minimum of 25 participants is required.
