November is an interesting month: some days are sunny and beautiful, and some are windy and cold; things look brown and gray and dead, but life is constantly being renewed; we continue on with our daily routines but are preparing for the happy disruptions of the holidays; the earth is settling into its winter rest, but we are as busy as ever. During November, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls and ends the Church year with the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, this year on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. The cycles of the seasons and the beauty and significance of the Liturgical Calendar can bring us closer to God, the Creator of time and seasons, and His Son, to whose Church we belong. But we have to tune in and be attentive.

It's sometimes easier said than done, but we need to try, both when we are preoccupied and busy when we are not.

Bishop Solis, during our Pastoral visit with him last month, expressed his gratitude for all the women, especially the women of Council, who faithfully serve the Church through various capacities. It is said that "If you are too busy to do the will of God, you are too busy." The willingness to take time to serve – be it your family, your friends, your parish, your community, or total strangers – is a gift from God. All of you who accept that gift and make time to serve, for saying "yes" to God, thank you. And thank you especially for your willingness to give your time, share your talents, and serve through the Council of Catholic Women.
