#### CONSECRATION OF THE DIOCESE TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY OF FATIMA



OCTOBER 14-15, 2017

On September 27, 2017 gathered for their provincial meeting, Archbishop Chaput and the bishops of Pennsylvania entrusted the ecclesial province of Pennsylvania to Our Lady of Fatima. This year marks 100 years since the apparitions in Fatima, Portugal which occurred May 13- October 13, 1917.

This weekend, each of the parishes of each of the dioceses of Pennsylvania is praying the Prayer of Consecration to Our Lady of Fatima. Bishop Gainer asks that all the parishes in the Diocese of Harrisburg celebrate the votive Mass of Our Lady, Model of the Church at each of the Sunday Masses throughout the Diocese for that weekend.

Today's Scripture readings are NOT be the 28<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time as found in the *Today's Missal*. Instead the readings are:

- Genesis 3:9-15, 20
- Judith 13:18-19
- Galatians 4:4-7
- John 19:25-27

The diocese has provided special General Intercession. At the conclusion of the General Intercessions, the assembly kneels and the priest prays the prayer of Consecration with the people.

#### **Prayer of Consecration to Our Lady of Fatima**



Hail, Mother of the Lord, Virgin Mary, Queen of the Rosary of Fatima! Blessed among all women, you are the image of the Church dressed in the Paschal light, you are the honor of our people, you are the triumph over the mark of evil.

Prophecy of the merciful Love of the Father,
Teacher of the Annunciation of the Good News of the Son,
Sign of the burning Fire of the Holy Spirit, teach us,
in this valley of joys and sorrows,
the eternal truths that the Father reveals to the little ones.

Show us the strength of your mantle of protection.
In your Immaculate Heart, be the refuge of sinners and the way that leads to God.
In unity with our brothers and sisters,
In Faith, Hope and Love, We surrender ourselves to you.
In unity with all our brothers and sisters, through you,
we consecrate ourselves to God, O Virgin of the Rosary of Fatima.

And thus surrounded by the Light that comes from your hands, We will give Glory to the Lord for ever and ever.

#### Daily Mass... Why Go?

Cheryl Adams has been attending weekday Masses (in addition to Sunday Mass) for a little over 6 months now. Why?

#### 1. Recall the first time you attended a daily Mass. How was it different from a Sunday Mass?

The first time I attended daily Mass was in the chapel at the Catholic school in Powhatan, Virginia, where I taught. The Mass was much more intimate because there were few of us, there were no distractions, and the space was much smaller. Additionally, it was shorter and without music. Although at Our Lady of the Visitation the daily Mass is in a larger space there still seems to be that intimacy.

#### 2. What prompted you to start attending daily Mass

When I moved back to Shippensburg last fall, I was retired and had the time to attend daily Mass. At first, I did so infrequently and at the prompting of the Holy Spirit. I wanted to draw closer to Jesus in the Eucharist but found I didn't want to make the effort every day.

#### 3. Why do you still attend daily Mass? What is the benefit you feel from it?

Now if I don't make the effort to attend daily Mass, or if I can't attend for some reason, I feel something is missing from my day. There is no other way for me to experience Jesus so intimately. I need His presence within me throughout the day so I can be His light to those with whom I will interact. I am uplifted by the scripture readings, the brief homily, and the receiving of our Lord's Body and Blood. My awareness of Christ's presence in my life grows keener and my faith grows stronger each day that I attend Mass.

# 4. Thinking of those who have never attended daily Mass, what would you want to say to encourage those who could attend but do not?

Wow! Do you know what you are missing?

Jesus offers His Body and Blood to us every day in the Mass. There is so much joy that comes from sharing in this greatest of gifts to us that you are missing by not coming to daily Mass. When you are struggling with life's challenges, Jesus is there at the Mass on the altar just waiting to love you, comfort you, and help you. Sunday is just not enough if you want to draw closer to Jesus and strengthen your faith and trust in Him.

What is keeping you away? What is more important than your relationship with God and the intimacy you can have with Jesus in the Eucharist? Give Jesus a half hour of your time at daily Mass. You will be surprised at how much joy you will have and how much better your life will seem when you do.
